At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14th day of September, A. D. 1887, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Decatur —, in said county, setting forth that they labor under

great inconvenience for want of a public road in Decatur Township to lead from a point on the Coal run road about 400 yards South of Flynn's Old Camp to another point on the Parsonville Road about 200 yards East of the Village of Spruceville —

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, I Refer to the Leet whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint A. H. Hartman Alfred Fuller & Matthew Rowes who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.





WE THE UNDERSIGNED PERSONS APPOINTED BY THE WITHIN ORDER OF COURT TO VIEW AND LAY OUT THE ROAD WITHIN MENTIONED, RESPECTFULLY REPORT, THAT HAVING BEEN PRESENT AT THE VIEW OF THE GROUND PROPOSED FOR SUCH ROAD AND HAVING ALL BEEN FIRST SEVERALLY SWORN OR AFFIRMED IN PURSUANCE OF THE SAID ORDER, WE HAVE VIEWED AND LAID OUT AND DO RETURN FOR PUBLIC USE, THE FOLLOWING ROAD TO WIT:-- BEGINNING AT A POINT ON THE ROAD LEADING FROM BRISBIN TO ASHLAND ABOUT FOUR HUNDRED YARDS SOUTH OF ELYNN'S OLD CAMP OR MORE EXACTLY TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY FOUR FEET NORTH THIRTY DEGREES AND THIRTY ONE MINUTES EAST FROM WHERE SAID ROAD CROSSES THE SMALL STREAM IN PUMPKIN HOLLOW; THENCE SOUTH SEVENTY ONE DEGREES AND TWENTY SEVEN MINUTES WEST ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY EIGHT FEET; THENCE SOUTH EIGHTY THREE DEGREES AND FIFTY TWO MINUTES WEST THREE HUNDRED AND NINE FEET; THENCE NORTH EIGHTY NINE DEGREES AND FORTY FOUR MINUTES WEST ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY ONE FEET; THENCE NORTH EIGHTY ONE DEGREES AND FIFTY THREE MINUTES WEST THREE HUNDRED AND TWENTY NINE FEET; THENCE NORTH EIGHTY TWO DEGREES AND FORTY ONE MINUTES WEST THREE HUNDRED AND NINETY TWO FEET; THENCE SOUTH SEVENTY THREE DEGREES AND FIFTY SIX MINUTES WEST EIGHT HUNDRED AND TWO FEET; THENCE SOUTH TWELVE DEGREES WEST TWO HUNDRED AND SIXTY EIGHT FEET; THENCE SOUTH FORTY FOUR DEGREES AND SEVEN MINUTES WEST, EIGHTY SIX FEET; THENCE SOUTH NINE DEGREES AND EIGHT MINUTES EAST ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY EIGHT
