At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14th day of September, A. D. 1887, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pekey, in said county, setting forth that that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road. Beginning at a point on the public road near the house of John Wrennells and leading by the nearest and best route to the foundry of the Susquehanna river near 26 Fairview in said township and vacate the road now in use from said John Wrennells to Robert Addessans and also from said point of Pekey to Pekey

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to the court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Tho. W. Wood Gervis Schofield Aug. Bloom who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.




ASSESSMENT OF DAMAGES.

To the Honorable Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County

We the undersigned viewers appointed by the foregoing Order of Court to View the Road therein described - Do, Report - That first having given due notice of the time and place of meeting and also notice to the owners & occupants of land through which said Road was intended to pass of the same we all met and being duly Affirmed did proceed to view the ground proposed for said road and are of the opinion that the same is necessary and have therefore viewed laid out and do return for Public use the following Road, Beginning at a Post in the Public road near the house of John McNaul Then through land of said McNaul South seventy six degrees west, six hundred & sixteen feet to an ironwood on line of Isaiah Caldwell, Then through land of said Caldwell, South fifty nine degrees and thirty minutes west, four hundred & twenty feet to a Post, Then South sixty seven degrees and thirty minutes west, eight hundred & fifty feet to a Post, Then South forty three degrees west, six hundred & forty feet to a Post on line of Mr. Hamells land, Then through the same South nineteen degrees west, ten hundred & fifty feet to a Post South fifty nine degrees west, two hundred & six feet to a Rock at the Susquehanna River, a draft of

which is hereunto annexed and we have
also vacated, as in our opinion should be,
all of the old Road leading from a Point near
the House of John McWaul to Isaiah Caldwell's
and which the new road is intended to supply
and also an old road now not used for many
years leading from Robert Adelmann's across
the River into the old Caldwell Road either
of which are in our opinion now necessary
for Public use.
