Clearfield County, ss:—

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Third day of March, A. D. 1887, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Brady, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road on Highway to leave from the farm Barn of William Reckler or public road leading from J. F. Rishel's farm to William Reckler to a point at or near Benj. Rishel's house or road leading from Butherford to Lanes Mill.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo C Kirk Erastus Luther W. Dan Goodlance who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Release of Damages.

ASSESSMENT OF DAMAGES.

The following persons, having refused to release the damages to which they respectively may be entitled by reason of the location and the opening of the said road in the annexed return described, we, the undersigned viewers, under oath in pursuance of our duty, under the Act of Assembly, do assess their damages and make report thereof, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Judges within named; We the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order do report; That in pursuance whereof, after having been severally duly sworn according to law, all the petitioners appointed by said order, viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road, and we do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the ground for such road, we have laid out in such manner as shall, in our opinion, do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described road to wit: - Beginning at a post in the public road at Wm Radaker's barn; thence through improved lands of said Wm Radaker, N. 59° W., 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ per. to a pine stump on lands of Geo. A. Weber; thence through improved lands of said Geo. A. Weber, N. 50° W., 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ per. to pine stump; thence N. 44° 30' W., 22 per. to a post; thence N. 7° 30' W., 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ per. to a pine stump, on M. J. McAninch's land; thence North on line between lands of said McAninch and Henry Rishel, 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ per. to a post; thence through improved land of said Rishel, N. 34° E., 8 per. to a post; thence N. 6° E., 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ per. to a post in the public road, near P. C. Rishel's House. We further report that no damages result to any one through whose land said road passes, from opening the same, and we annex a plot or draft of said road laid out, stating the courses and distances, and noticing briefly the improvements through which the same passes.
