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Road Viewers Report

To the Honorable the Judges Within named -
We the undersigned persons appointed by
the Within order of Court, to view and lay out
the road therein mentioned, respectfully report
that having been present, at the view of the
ground proposed for such road, and having
all been first severally sworn or affirmed
in pursuance of the Said order we have
Reviewed and laid out, and do return
for public use, the following road, to wit:
Beginning at a post in road leading
from Hoover Hughes & Lees Mill to Penfield.
thence North Fifteen and one fourth degrees East
Four Hundred and Twenty two feet through Hoover
Hughes & Lees Land cleared to a post. Thence through
wood land north Seventy seven and one fourth degrees East
Five Hundred and thirty five feet to a post. Thence
north Twenty four and one half degrees East, one hundred
and fifty feet to a post. Thence North Fifteen degrees
East, one Hundred and fifty feet to a post. Thence
North Five degrees East one hundred and fifty feet
to a post. Thence North Fifteen degrees East, one hundred
and fifty feet to a post. Thence North Twenty four
degrees East, Two hundred feet to a post. Thence
North Nineteen and three fourths degrees West, one hundred

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the ninth day of March, A. D. 1887, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Houston, in said county, setting forth that a public road

was laid out from near Hoover Hughes & Co's mill on Nelson run to the public road near mill run still and are of the opinion that a better route can be made for said road, better on account of the cost to make it and maintain and accommodate the public, They therefore ask for a review of same from some point above Hoover Hughes & Co's mill on the Nelson run road to some suitable ~~point~~ in the present road

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, & make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. L. Votung, P. B. Gould & J. H. Lucore who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
