

Clearfield County, ss: 

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 27th day of October, A. D. 1887, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public Road to lead from a front door of George Starr to public road at or near Hillman's Peoples in Pike Township.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, make Report at next Term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Ed Read John Quinlan & Richard Freeman who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

order of Court respectfully report That after giving
good and lawful notice of the time and place of
Meeting we met in pursuance of said notice

Also—Viewers will appreciate the number of days employed in settling the amount due at the foot of their return. Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.

X-B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
