At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 17th day of Sept, A. D. 1888, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Goschen & Lawrence, in said county, setting forth that the public road

Known as the Lick run road between Joseph Shaws mill & where the said road crosses Goschen public road at Lick run has become useless & burdensome to the inhabitants of said Township to keep in repair & that its place can be supplied by a road much shorter in distance which would better accommodate the inhabitants of said Township by laying out and opening a public road from said Joseph Shaws mill to intersect the said Goschen road as near the top of Lick Run hill

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint C. C. Reed, Thompson Reed & H. R. Shirell who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, Pa.

The petition of the undersigned, citizens of the
Township of Lawrence, said County, respectfully represents;

That a petition was filed in said Court to No. 7 Dec. 1888, praying for the appointment of viewers to Vacate and Supply a Public road in the Townships of Lawrence and Goshen, as follows: That that part of the Public road, known as the Lick run road, between Jos. Shaw's mill, and where the said road crosses the Goshen Public road at Lick run, has become useless, and burdensome to the inhabitants of the Township to keep in repair, and that its place can be supplied by a road much shorter in distance, which would better accomodate the inhabitants of the township, by laying out and opening a public road from said Joseph Shaw's mill to intersect the said Goshen road at or near the top of Lick run hill.

That on the 17th. Sept. 1888 E. C. Read- Thompson Read and Wm. R. Shimel were appointed viewers and on the 21st. of Nov. 1888 they filed their report.

Your petitioners would therefore remonstrate against the said road and pray your Honorable Court to refuse to confirm the report for the following reasons, viz;

1st. The said road as vacated and laid out is not a necessity
2nd. That the said road as vacated and laid out would not accomodate any but one or two parties who would use it for lumbering.

3rd. That the said Township is greatly in debt and that the building of said road would be an unnecessary and useless outlay of money.

1	4th. That the viewers of said road have failed to annex or re-
2	turn a plot or draft of said road.
3	5th. That the viewers have failed to assess the damages to per-
4	sons over whose land said road is laid out and also failed to
5	procure from such persons releases from all claims for damages
6	as provided by the Act of Assembly of 14th. May 1874.
