To the Honorable the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Clearfield County, Pa.

The petition of the undersigned citizens of Burnside Town-
ship, in said County would respectfully represent;

That during the late high floods in the
Sussquehanna River, the public bridge crossing said river in said Town-
ship at Patchins and McElwain's mill on the public mail route leading
from Curwensville to Cherrytree was swept away and that the citizens
of Burnside Township and the upper end of the County generally suffer
great inconvenience for want of said bridge. They further represent
that the expense attending the erection of a new bridge is greater
than should be wholly borne by the citizens of said Township.

They would therefore pray your Honorable Court to appoint three dis-
interested viewers to view and make report at next term, with a view
to having the County make an appropriation out of it's treasury towards
the erection of said bridge, as provided by the act of General Assem-
bly approved the 16th. day of April A.D. 1870,

We the undersigned persons appointed by the Court as per the order, to view the Bridge Site therein mentioned, Respectfully report, That having given notice of the time and place of meeting, according to the Act of Assembly, and being all present at the view of the Site proposed for the said Bridge, and being all sworn or affirmed in pursuance of the said order, we have viewed and agreed upon a location, a short distance below the Great Mill of Patchin and McEwenine, where the line between Towns Patchin and Moses McEwenine comes to the River, at a marked White Oak stump,

Said Bridge will require a single span thirty-40- feet in length, and the abutments to be built fifteen-10- feet high, above low water mark, We are of opinion said Bridge is necessary for public use, and we are of the opinion that the expense of erecting said Bridge would be too great for the Townships of Bensenville to bear, We would therefore recommend that the County Commissioners assist in the erection of said Bridge by making an appropriation out of the County Treasury, as is provided by the Act of Assembly passed the 16 day of April A.D. 1870.
