

Quarter-sessions of Clearfield County, we, the undersigned
witnesses appointed by the written order of Court to view
vacate and supply the road therein mentioned respectfully
report that we gave lawful notice of said roadview by having
notice posted and met agreeable thereto on Wednesday
the twenty sixth day of September A.D. 1888, and all being present
and having been first severally sworn or affirmed ^{that} to
perform the duties of our appointment with impartiality and
fidelity, we examined the route of the road (No. 35, S.W.
sections 1883, as named in the written order and are of the
opinion that said road is the best and most convenient
route with the least expense in the end to the tax payers
of Woodward Township and all properly interested persons
a plot or draft of which is hereto annexed showing the
several courses and distances and improvements
which road in our opinion is necessary for a
Public Road. Witness and hands this fifth day
of October in the year of Our Lord One thousand
Eight hundred and Eighty Eight.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 21st day of August, A. D. 1888, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Woodward, in said county, setting forth that a public road

72038 Sep 25 1883 Beginning at the South End of Good Street in the Borough of Nuttallburg running to a point in the center of the street in the Village of Moon has lately been laid out the opening thereto is now in the hands of the Supervisors of Woodland Township that they are of the opinion that a much better road can be laid out to leave from said Borough to the Village of Moon one which could be constructed at much less expense to the late Grayers of said Town

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, to make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Sims W.W. Worrell T.C. Denney who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Minority Report.

To the Honorable David S. Krebs Judge
of the court of Quarter Sessions of Clear-
field County, the undersigned viewer
appointed by the within order of court to
view and lay out the road therein men-
tioned respectfully report that the road
mentioned in this order of court is not
the best route from Hontzdale to the village
Moran, and having met with W. D. Eisenberg & W.
Morrell, and being affomed on the day appointed
for the roadview, have viewed the ground and
believe that the part of said road between the
point where it leaves Good Street, and the
White oak tree near Whiteide school-house
should be vacated and supplied by a road
beginning at a point on Good St fifty four
perches from a Railroad siding in Hontzdale thence
going South eleven degrees west (the course of Good Street)
seventy eight
fifty five and sixty nine hundredth perches to the
intersection of Good Street with second avenue, making
the entire distance on Good Street one hun-
dred thirty two and sixty nine hundredth perches three
south twenty eight degrees and nine minutes east
twenty seven and fifty four hundredth perches to a
stump at corner of Park thence south twenty one
and one half degrees east fifty seven and forty-
four hundredth perches to a stump at the other end
of Park thence south nine and one half degrees
east ninety four perches to a stump at an old
road leading from Hontzdale to Whiteide follow-
ing said road thirty and one eighth degrees west
thirteen perches, south eight and three fourth degrees

twelve and twelve hundredth perches south four and one
half degrees east twenty and thirty six hundredth
perches south three degrees west twenty and thirty
two hundredth perches south eight and one eighth degree
east twenty three and sixty four hundredth perches, south
thirty six and seven eighth perches west thirteen
and thirty two hundredth perches, south seventy
five and five eighth perches west eleven and seven
hundredth perches thence south fifty degrees west
twelve and eighty one hundredth degrees perches,
south twenty two and five eighth degrees west seven and
sixty three hundredth perches, south forty one and one
fourth degree west four and sixteen hundredth perches
south one and one eighth degree east eleven and eight
hundredth perches, south twenty eight and one half degree
west thirteen and fifty two hundredth perches, south
forty three and one half degrees west ten and seventy
two hundredth perches to a white oak now
lying beside said road, and thence road follows
former known to the village Morany, and same
route as the other viewers favor. In the plot
or draft accompanying this report the part
of the road described herein is marked with
a red line the part of the road which ~~this~~
takes the place of is the part to be vacated.
