At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of

May, A. D. 1880, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Ferguson, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under a great inconvenience for want of a convenient road or highway to lead from township road at or near the residence of John Stotts in Ferguson Township to intersect township road at residence of E. C. Barrett in same Township.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Terry Myers, John Straw & C. Shoff, who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Note.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.  
Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.  
X. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

### ORDER

To dig and lay out a Road  
For public use in the township

To the honorable David S. Krebs, judge of the court of quarter sessions of Clearfield Co., we the undersigned persons appointed by the within order of court to view and lay out the road within mentioned, respectfully report that having given due notice of said road view and meeting as per notice as required by law and the rules of the court on the seventh day of June A.D. 1885, and all the viewers being present, we were first severally sworn or affirmed in pursuance of said order, after which we viewed and laid out, and do return for public use the following road, to wit: beginning at a point in middle of public road at the end of John Tubb lane thence south thirty nine degrees east twenty eight and two-tenths perches near the line between J. H. and John Tubb to post, thence south twenty one degrees west thirty two perches to a hemlock in the wood, thence south eleven and one half degrees west fifteen and eight hundredth perches to a hemlock, thence south twenty nine and three fourths degrees east four and nine tenth perches to post, thence south fifty and one fourth degrees east seven perches to a chestnut stump, thence through wood and field of E. C. Barrett south fifty three degrees east forty eight perches to point in public between two small pines one of which is notched. A draft or plot of which is hereto annexed showing the neighboring houses to be accommodated by said road, and the various seated and unseated land through which it passes, which road laid out as aforesaid is necessary
