To the Honorable David S. Krebs, Judge
of the court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield
County, we the undersigned viewers appointed
by the annexed order of court to view and lay out
the within mentioned road, respectfully re-
port, that all the appointed viewers met
on the tenth day of July ^{A.D. 1888} in pursuance of
the notices ^{duly} posted, we were first sever-
ally sworn or affirmed and then proceeded
to lay out according to the within instructions
the following road, to wit, beginning at end
of a lane near J. C. Steinberchner ^{and} opposite a school
house, thence along said lane ^{on the line} between the J. M. Tol-
mar and Wm Fohmar on one side and J. C. and J. Stein-
berchner on the other south eighty five and one half
degrees east forty-four and ^{seven} ~~eight~~ tenth perches
to a post eight and one half feet from corner of
J. C. and J. Steinberchner and on line between J.
Steinberchner and Wm Fohmar, thence parallel
with line of J. C. Steinberchner and eight and one
half feet from it south four and one half degrees
west one hundred thirty-eight and eighty-four hun-
dredth perches to post on land of Clearfield Bitumin-
ous Coal Company near a fence, Thence road
goes through land of same as follows: south
fourteen degrees east forty six and ^{fifty-four} ~~seven~~ hundredth
perches to an oak thence north eighty two east
ninety and four hundredth ^{perches} to an oak thence
south thirty seven and one half degrees east eight
perches to a post thence south five and one half
degrees west nine and eight tenth perches to a
maple thence south two degrees west sixteen

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed by the petitioner for said road.
 Viewers will carefully note the number of days estimated and set the amount out at the foot of their return, and viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the road viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.
 B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

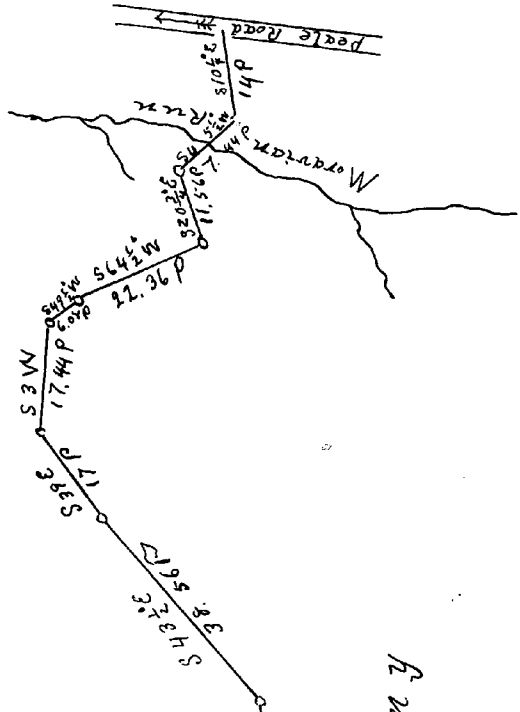
