At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 15 day of

May, A. D. 1888, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence, in

said county, setting forth that ~~they labor~~

under great inconvenience for want
of a Public Road to lead from a point in
Township road at or near the Bloomington
Mining Co. Ripple thence to intersect a public
road leading from Josiah H. Thompson to
Bloomington Pa at or near the ~~old~~
Orchard on the A.C. Late farm.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to next Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Ryers Daniel Stewart & L. Denning who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



To the Honorable David S. Krebs, Judge of the Court
of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, we the
undersigned viewers appointed by the within order
of court, to view and layout the road therein
mentioned, respectfully report; that having
given due notice of said road view by having
notices posted and meeting as per notices on the
thirtieth day of July A.D. 1888, all being present and having
been first severally sworn or affirmed, we have laid
out and do return for public use the following
road to wit: beginning at a corner at the pub-
lic road, and between land of A.C. Tate and James Thom-
pson estates thence on the line between said estates
North sixty three degrees East forty three and eighty-eight hundred
thousand perches to a corner of the said A.C. Tate estate and on
said line between said estates, thence same course but between
land of Lafayette Thompson and said James Thompson estate
eleven and four-tenth perches to a post, thence on said James
Thompson Estate south sixty eight degrees east thirty five and eight
hundred perches to a pine thence through same south thirty three and three-
fourth degrees east five and eight hundred perches to a tall oak
thence through same south twenty seven degrees east one and
four-tenth perches to line between said Thompson estate and Blaw-
mington Mining Company, thence same course through Cherry street
between Richey on land of said Mining Company eleven and thirty-three
hundred perches to a post thence through sixth ave in said
town North sixty three degrees east thirty two perches to pub-

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of a road, they will report to that effect.
