

ted by the viewers, under the aforesaid

aforesaid.

To the honorable David S. Krebs
judge of the court of Quarter Sessions
of Clearfield County, we the undersigned
viewers appointed by the within order
of court to view and lay out the within
mentioned road, respectfully report, that
having given due notice of said road
view, and having met as per notices on the
eleventh day of July A.D. 1888, all the viewers
being present, and all having been first sever-
ally sworn or affirmed, and having regard
to the shortest route, best ground and the
route causing least injury to private property
we have laid out and do return for pri-
vate use the following road, to wit;
beginning at a point in public road leading
from Egertown to Philipsburg, midway
between two lots sold to two swedes by
G. C. Davis who reserved twenty feet for
roads, thence south seventy-five degrees east
seventy-eight and twenty-four hundredth perches to
a post, thence North eighty-five degrees east six
and thirty-two hundredth perches to a birch, thence
North forty-seven degrees east seventeen and six
tenths perches to a Maple on land of G. C. Davis
thence north seven degrees east eleven and
twenty-eight hundredth perches to a pine stump on
line Henderson and Davis, thence North one and
one half degrees west twenty-four perches to a cherry
thence North sixty degrees east fifteen and forty-four
hundredth perches to a pine stump on land of
Stephen Henderson, near his barn, a plot or

draft of said road is hereto annexed showing
courses and distances and the places to be accom-
modated by road which road as laid out
afore said is necessary for a private road
and not a public road as prayed for
by the petitioners. Witness our hands this

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28th day of

May, A. D. 1880, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Cooper & Morris, in

said county, setting forth that they have incurred

great inconvenience for want of a public road to lead from a point on public road from Keyserstown to Philipsburg at or near the fence of a farm on farm of George Davis in Cooper Township to a point at or near Stephen Henderson's house in Morris Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Dyer, Clark Dale & A. Hanbury who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
