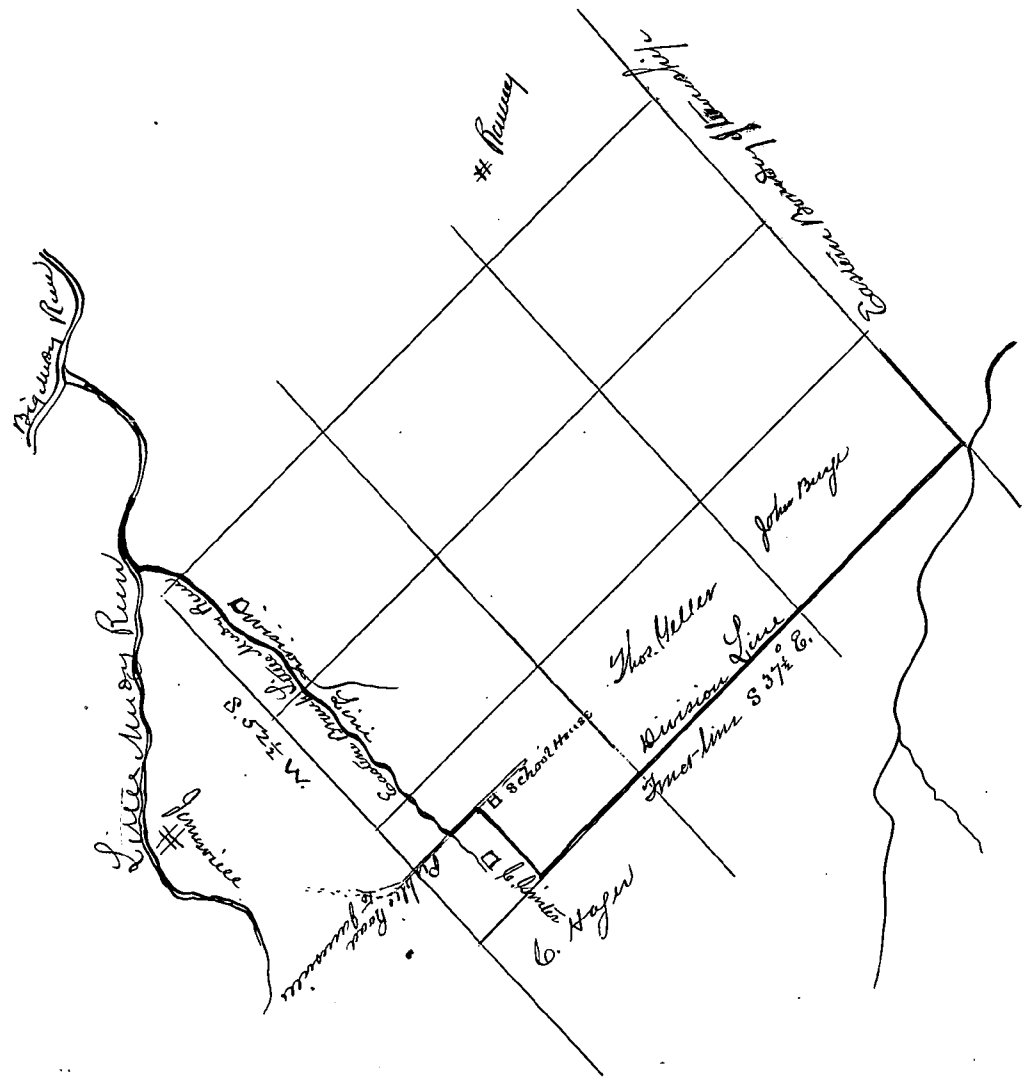

to divide the Township into two Election districts
will be satisfactory to the voters of Genlick Town-
=ship Beginning at a point on little muddy
run, where the East branch of said run enters
the same Thence along said run to Township Road
at a point near Conrad Guter House Thence along
Township road east of School House to land line
of the Thomas Gedler & Matthew Young Tracts of land
to line of Woodward Township along said Woodward
Township to line of Bigler Township Thence along
said line of Bigler Township to Muddy Run Thence
up Muddy Run to place of Beginning a draft of
which is herewith attached After viewing the
line to divide Genlick Township into two Election
District and having all been first sworn & affirmed

are of the opinion that there is occasion and
it is necessary for the convenience of the voters
of Genlich Township that it should be amended
and that there is a sufficient number of voters
to make Ramay the place for holding the Election
