The Petition of the Town Council
of Out Bail Borough respectfully
sheweth: That on the 7th day
of October 1889 by an ordinance
lawfully passed Stockdale Street in
said Borough was ordained
laid out and extended as
follows: Beginning at a point
on the East side of Scribner Ave.
directly opposite the Southwest
corner of Scribner Avenue and
Stockdale Street, Thence in a
line running the same course
as the south line of Stockdale
Street between Long St. and
Scribner Avenue, to Sandy
Creek, Thence down Sandy
Creek 50 ft. Thence in a line
parallel with the above described
south line of the extension of said
Stockdale Street, and at all points
50 ft distant from the same to
Scribner Avenue.

Your Petitioners further sheweth
that the extension of said Street
passes through and occupies a portion

of lots owned respectively by
P. H. Kirk, Bridget Shea, Jno. E.
McBair and William Clinton.
That your Petitioners have been
unable to agree with the owners
of said lot for the damages caused
by the extension of said street,
They therefore pray that jurors
may be appointed according to
law to assess said damage.

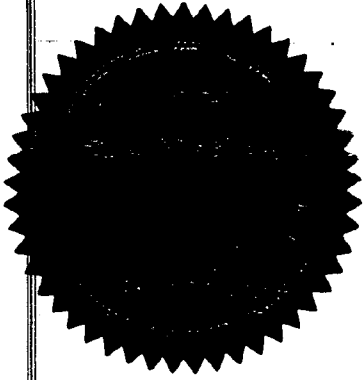

December A.D. 1889 Before the Honorable David
LeKretts Presiding Judge of said Court upon
the petition of Sundry Inhabitants of the
Borough of Derry in said County Respectfully
represents: That on the 7th day of October
1889 by an Ordinance duly passed Stockdale
Street in said Borough was Ordained laid out
and Extended as follows: Beginning at a point
on the East Side of Scriven Avenue directly
Opposite the Southwest Corner of Scriven
Avenue and Stockdale Street, thence in a
line running the same Course as South line
of Stockdale Street between Long Street
and Scriven Avenue to Sandy Creek. Thence
down Sandy Creek 70 feet. Thence in a line
parallel with the above described South line
of the Extension of said Stockdale Street and
at all points 50 feet distance from the
same to Scriven Avenue.

And now 2nd Dec. 1889. The within petition
read and considered and thereupon H.B.
Merriman J.B. Ellis William Stephenson
J.A. Johnson A.R. Van Gassel F.W. Proctor
and J.E. Morris are appointed Viewers
to View the premises and assess the
damages and make return to the
