## RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, owners of lands through which the road located by the viewers, under the annexed order, passes, for and in consideration of the sum of ONE DOLLAR to us respectively paid by the ..... at and before the ensealing and delivery hereof, have remised, released and forever quit-claimed, and do hereby remise, release and forever quit-claim to the said ..... all damages that may arise to us respectively by reason of the location and opening of the said road, so that neither we nor any of us, nor any person claiming under us, can or may hereafter ask, sue for, demand, have or receive any damages for injuries arising or growing out of the location and opening of the road aforesaid.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 21<sup>st</sup>) day of December, A. D. 1889, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Union, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great encumbrance for want of a public road on the highway to lead from Pocoh road leading from Paetschville to Rockton so as to intersect the public road leading from Eric Yelk to Clauford road about near Leeks Haags in Union Township in Clearfield Co Pa

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make a road by the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo Clark & Henry Lentz as viewers who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

To the Honorable, the Judge within named: We the undersigned,  
appointed by the annexed order do report, That in pursuance thereof,  
after having been duly sworn according to law, all the viewers appointed  
by said order, viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned  
road, and we do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by  
the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And  
having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such  
road, we have laid out in such manner as shall, in our opinion,  
do the least injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably  
to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following  
described road, to wit: Beginning at a post in the public road leading  
from Packerville to Rockton, thence on unimproved lands of Jos. Walker  
North  $8^{\circ}$  West, ten and  $\frac{4}{10}$  perches to Post, thence North  $23^{\circ} 45' 40''$  West, Thirtysix  
and  $\frac{4}{10}$  perches to Post, thence North  $17^{\circ}$  West, eleven and  $\frac{4}{10}$  perches to Post,  
thence North  $42^{\circ}$  West, twelve perches to Hera. Stump, thence South  $85^{\circ} 40' 40''$  West  
six perches to Post, thence North  $24^{\circ}$  West, sixteen perches to post on land  
of Elliot Hollopeter, thence over improved land of said Hollopeter, North  
 $117^{\circ}$  West, thirty-two perches to Post, thence over unimproved land of said  
Hollopeter, North  $41^{\circ}$  West eighty perches to Post in public road leading  
from Erie pike to Clearfield road, near Lewis Haago. We further report  
that there are no damages resulting to any of the owners of the land over which  
said road passes from opening the same, and that before said view, public notice  
of the time and place of the meeting of said viewers was given by advertisements  
put up before said meeting, and no owner a plot or draft of said road laid  
out, stating the courses and distances, and noticing briefly the improvements  
through which the same passes.

Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.  
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
