





RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, owners of lands through which the road located by the viewers, under the annexed order, passes, for and in consideration of the sum of ONE DOLLAR to us respectively paid by the at and before the ensealing and delivery hereof, have remised, released and forever quit-claimed, and do hereby remise, release and forever quit-claim to the said all damages that may arise to us respectively by reason of the location and opening of the said road, so that neither we nor any of us, nor any person claiming under us, can or may hereafter ask, sue for, demand, have or receive any damages for injuries arising or growing out of the location and opening of the road aforesaid.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 4th day of

Sept, A. D. 1889, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence, in said county, setting forth that a road long

Since late each and leading from a point on which
is known as Joseph Shaws tree road in Lawrence
Lip to a point at or near the mouth of Creek river
in Goshen Lip has become useless & burdensome to the
people of said Township & pray you Court to appoint viewers
to view & estate that portion of said road leading through
said township of Lawrence & to supply the same with
a road leading from a point at or near Alexander Read's
farm in Goshen Township to a point in Lawrence
Lip leading from Mount Joy to Clearfield

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make report to the Court
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do ordene and appoint Harry Byers D.W. Wood & Frank Mitchell
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

the undersigned viewers appointed
by the within order of court to view
vacate and supply the road therein
mentioned respectfully report that
we gave lawful notice of said road-
view by having notices posted and met
agreeable thereto on Monday November
twenty sixth A.D 1889. and having all
been severally sworn or affirmed we
have viewed vacated and supplied the
following roads. viz: Beginning at Shaw
new road we vacated as follows: south
twenty seven and one fourth degrees east
eighteen and two tenth perches, south thir-
ty nine and one half degrees east twenty
four and eight tenth perches, south thr-
ty one and one fourth degrees east fifteen
and eight tenth perches, south forty five
degrees east eighteen and four tenth perches
south sixty nine and three fourth degrees east
ten and one tenth perches south eighty seven
and three fourth degrees east five and seven
tenth perches south seventy eight and one
fourth degrees east nineteen and six tenth
perches, south fifty seven and one half de-

forty seven degrees east fifteen and
six tenth perches south seventy degrees east
twelve and one tenth perches south fif-
ty two degrees east thirteen and nineteenth
perches south six ty three degrees east
ten and eight tenth perches, south six
ty degrees east twenty perches, south
twenty eight and three fourth degrees
east thirteen and six tenth perches,
south forty four degrees east five
and nine tenth perches to point on
road from Alexander Reads to
Clearfield. Second, beginning at a point
fifty two rods distant from point just
mentioned on road from Alexander Reads
to Clearfield we vacated also the road which
was washed out by the June flood, south
five and one half degrees west twelve
and eight tenth perches, thence south fa-
ty seven and one fourth degrees east
six and one tenth perches to a point
about two rods from south side of Slick
run, which last piece of road vacated
be supplied by laying out a road north
seven and one half degrees east nine and
six tenth perches north forty seven and
one half degrees west twenty and three
tenth perches to the beginning of second.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
"Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.
Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report the same.
