

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Clearfield County, ss: 

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of

September, A. D. 1889, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Joshua, in

said county, setting forth that owing to the destruction by the late flood in the Tuguhannock river the road from the Narrows at the South corner of Michael Shope's field in said township to the lower end of the bottom on Burns' land pray the Court to appoint suitable persons to view and lay out a road and cause the same to be supplied therewith

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, make report to the Court, whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Peijers R. S. Stearns & Selmao Sturz who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

## RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

the undersigned viewers appointed by the court  
as per the within order to view the same and supply  
the roads there mentioned respectfully report that we had  
notices posted in due time and owing said view and  
met agreeable thereto on Monday Sept. 16. 1889 Harry Byers  
and R. S. Stewart being present, and having been first severally  
sworn or affirmed we have viewed the following road begin-  
ning at Narrows at Mitchell Slopes thence down the river  
bank North forty three and one half degrees east eighteen and four  
tenths perches north twenty four and three fourth degrees east thirteen  
and two tenth perches north six degrees east nine and eight  
tenths perches north eleven and one half degrees west eleven and  
nine tenth perches, north nineteen and three fourth degrees west  
fifty eight and nine tenth perches, north two and one fourth  
degrees east twenty three and four tenth perches, north thirty degrees  
east thirty three perches, north thirty seven and one half degrees  
east eighteen and four tenth perches to a point opposite a  
valley, where the road we supplied by laying out a road beginning  
at said point at lower end of flat at Davis thence up the river south  
forty five and one half degrees west twelve and two tenth perches to a post  
thence south thirty three and one half degrees west six and six tenth  
perches to a walnut, then a south thirty six degrees west twenty  
and two tenth perches to an ironwood thence south twenty five and  
one half degrees west seven and nine tenth perches to a post thence  
south thirty two and one half degrees west ten and one tenth perches  
to a red oak thence south twenty two and one fourth degrees west  
ten perches to a walnut thence south eleven and one half  
degrees west six and two tenth perches to a post thence south  
forty degrees west five and five tenth perches to a post thence  
thence south eight and one fourth degrees west sixteen and  
seven tenth perches to a walnut thence south six degrees  
east twenty four and one tenth perches to a post thence  
south fifteen degrees east twenty three and six tenth perches  
to a chestnut thence south twenty degrees east fourteen and  
three tenth perches to a walnut thence south twenty  
three degrees east four and two tenth perches to an ash  
thence south two degrees east eight and two tenth perches  
to a post thence south fourteen and three fourth deg-  
rees west nine and two tenth perches to a walnut at the  
narrows, a plot or draft of which road as mentioned aforesaid  
is hereto annexed showing courses and distances and no names  
and unimproved land through which they pass, which road  
as laid out aforesaid is necessary in our opinion for a  
public road. We believe no owner of land is entitled to any  
damages by reason of locating or opening said road.

Note.—In case of a private road, the road must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.  
Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.  
Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the new viewers.  
N.B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the individual qualities of the road, they will report to that effect.
