At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the
county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield,
in and for said county, on the 6th day of
May, A. D. 1887, before Judges
of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of
the township of Trady, in
said county, setting forth that ~~they have under~~

*great inconvenience for want of a road Beginning at a
public road leading from Union Township line to the
church (10⁶) mile stone on the Erie Turnpike. And that
a road has been long since laid out from the new
Turnpike leading to the Erie Turnpike part of which
road beginning at Union Township line passing through
JMDaughter's farm to the Erie Turnpike*

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the
same according to law, *and make report to the Court*
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and
appoint *Geo C Kirk Jackson Bonar Wm Bloom of Bloomsp*
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their
appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for
said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that
there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to
the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a
road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private
property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a
PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the
courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes,
and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands
said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if
any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions
to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been
sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners
or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of
the time of the view, according to the 14th Rule of Court.

To the Honorable, the Judges within named: We the undersigned, appearing by the annexed order do report, that in accordance thereto, after having been severally duly sworn according to law, all the several appointed by said order, views of the ground proposed for the within mentioned road, and our deacons, do the best inquiry to forward, fully, and as far as practicable agreeably to the duty of the Justices, and do return for public use the following described road, by wit, Beg-
 moving at a post in the Corn Township near the North (10th) mile
 stone, ridge through improved lands of A. M. & P. W. Stranahan, N. 50°
 W. one hundred and fifty (105) fathoms to post in line of Alex.
 Welchman's land, thence through improved lands of Alex.
 Alex. Welchman N. 70° 30' W. thirty-four fathoms to post in public road
 near Union Township line, the further report that there are no damages
 resulting in any way through whose lands said road passes, and that
 we have agreed and do vacate the following described public road
 to wit, Beginning at post of intersection of above described road near
 Union Township line, thence S. 72° 0' W. thirty-two fathoms to post in
 Corn Township line, thence S. 66° 30' W. twenty-one and 1/2 fathoms to post,
 thence S. 74° W. forty-two and 8/10 fathoms to post, thence South, thence
