To the Honorable Judge of the Court of Clearfield
County.

We the undersigned persons, appointed
by the within Order of Court, to view and lay
out the Road therein mentioned, Respectfully
report:

That having given notice of the time, and
place of meeting, according to the act of assem-
bly, and being all present, at the view of the ground
proposed for the said road, and being all sworn
in pursuance of the said Order of Court, we have
viewed, laid out, and well marked, the following
Road, and do return the same, Viz. Beginning
at a point in the Township Road leading from three runs
to the town of Cataract, in Kartians Township, by a marked
white Oak stump. Thence through land of Weaver & Beto
South Seventy eight degrees west. Twenty nine and two
tenths perches. South eighty five degrees west. Twenty perches.
South sixty five degrees west. Ten perches. South fifty three
degrees west. Sixty four perches. Thence through land
of Weaver and Beto, and land belonging to Laura
Price, West forty three and six tenths perches, Thence
South Sixty two and a half Degrees west. Eight, and
three tenths perches. South eighty five degrees
west. eight perches, to a Post; Thence North forty four $\frac{1}{2}$
Degrees west. Forty perches. North sixty eight degrees
west. Three and eight tenths perches to a marked Chestnut.
Thence still through land belonging to Laura Price.

North eighty nine degrees west, Twenty one and three tenths perches. Thence North eighty one degrees west, Twenty two perches. Thence North eighty two, and a half degrees west, Thirty five and six tenths perches to the township road leading from Salt Lick to Three Runs, near the residence of Wharton Cole.

A Plot, or Draft whereof is hereunto attached. Which said road, as aforesaid laid out, we are of opinion is necessary for public use.

And we are also of the opinion that no person, or persons, through whose land the said road passes, is entitled to any damage.

The Road proposed to be vacated in the within order we simply declare it vacated. We do not submit a draft or Plot of the said Road, for the reason that there is no road there. The Keating and Karthaus Rail Road, and the Flood, have entirely destroyed it.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 13th day of Sept, A. D. 1889, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Kaileus, in said county, setting forth that they labour under

great inconvenience for want of a public road leading from Salt Creek to their runs at a point near the residence of Whiting M. Cole in the township of Kaileus to end in the public road leading from the three runs to the town of Catarach in said township at a point about one half mile below the Village of Catarach. Vacate the public road now opened from the town of Belford to the Clinton Colvin

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. McElroy Laurnee Flood Joseph Rubley who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed.
N.B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the County of Clearfield. -

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the township of Karthaus, in said County, respectfully sheweth: -

That they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road to begin in a public road leading from Salt Lick to Three Runs, at a point near the residence of Wharton M Coles, in the township of Karthaus, and to end in a public road leading from Three Runs to the town of Cataract, in said township, at a point about one half mile below the said village of Cataract.

Your petitionees further represent that the present township road leading from Belford to the Clinton County line, by reason of the damage done said road by the late floods, has become inconvenient and burthensome to the inhabitants of said township, and the same can no longer be maintained as a public road without great expense, it being damaged more or less by the annual freshets in the river, and therefore burthensome and expensive.

Your petitioners, therefore, pray the Court to appoint viewers qualified according to law, to view the ground for the proposed road, and if they should see occasion to lay out the same, to inquire of and vacate the public road now opened from the town of Belford to the Clinton County line, as above described, which road, by reason of the laying out of the proposed road, will become useless: & to make report of their proceedings to the next term of Court.
