 long since been laid out from Public road

 at or near W. K. Bannister's farm in Penn Township
 this road ^{and running parallel with another road} is about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile long part of it
 through a deep swamp your Petitioners humbly
 conceive it now become useless inconvenient and
 burthensome to the inhabitants thereabouts
 your Petitioners therefore humbly pray your
 honors that the said road may be vacated
 agreeably to the act of Assembly the General
 Assembly in such cases made and provided
 and they will ever pray &c Jan^y 18th 1890

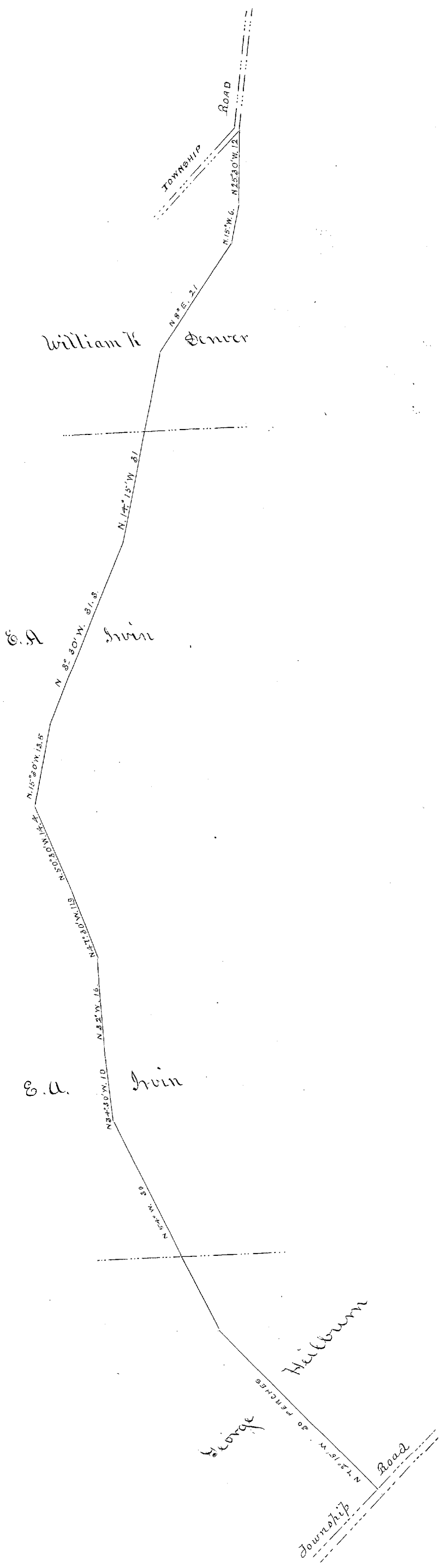

long part of it through a deep Swamp.

now 28^d January 1890 Petition read & considered
and thereupon D. F. McCloskey Estlin Rowles
& D. S. Morris are appointed Viewers who after being
respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties
of their appointment impartially and according
to the wish of their magistrates are to View the road
in said petition prayed to be vacated and
to consider and judge whether it is become
useless inconvenient and burdensome. and if they
or any ~~few~~ of them View the said road or any
~~part~~ of the actual Viewers agree that the same
is become useless inconvenient and burdensome
as aforesaid they shall make report accordingly
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held
for the said County.

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within
Order of Court to view and vacate the Road therein mention-
ed. Respectfully report.

That having given notice of the time and place of
meeting according to the act of assembly, and being all pres-
ent at the view of the Road proposed to be vacated, and being all
sworn or affirmed in pursuance of the said Order. We have
viewed the following Road to wit. Beginning at a Point in
the Township Road near George Weilmann's, and running through
his land, land of E. A. Irwin and land of William K. Denver. North
Seventy Two and a quarter degrees west. Thirty perches, thence
North fifty four degrees west. Thirty perches. North thirty
four and a half degrees west. Ten perches. North thirty two
degrees west. Fifteen perches. North forty seven, and a half
degrees west. Eleven and nine tenths perches. North fifty and
a half degrees west. fourteen and four tenths perches.
North fifteen and a half degrees west. Thirteen and five
tenths perches. North three and a half degrees west. thirty
One, and three tenths perches, North fourteen and a quarter
degrees west. Thirty one perches. North Eight Degrees -
East. Twenty one perches. North fifteen degrees west. Six
perches. North Twenty five and a half degrees west.
Twelve perches. to the ^{Brady} Township Road near William
K. Denver.

Which said Road as above described, we are of
Opinion is not in any way necessary for public
use. And we therefore declare it vacated.
