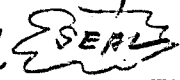
We the undersigned Viewers appointed to
view the masonry and superstructure of
the iron bridge recently erected at Rolling
Stone, by the Honorable Board of Com-
missioners of Clearfield County, do re-
spectfully report that after all having
been sworn or affirmed according to law
we proceeded to examine the same and
find that as far as we could discover
the same has been constructed according
to the plans and specifications, and
the same we consider safe and well
calculated to answer the purpose
it was intended for. With the following
exceptions:— The Specifications in the
Contract made with the Berlin Bridge Co -
call for good sound White Oak Stringers
and flooring. We find that ^{a good portion} ~~most~~ of the
lumber used is not sound and fully 50%
or more is of Red Oak. A proper reduction
for this item or a renewal of the flooring
should be
demanded.

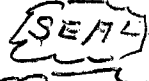
The Abutment on the ^{Cooper} ~~Canton~~ Town-
ship side we find and ^{know to be} a good first class
piece of work. The pier to all appearances
presents the same appearance

With regard to the Abutment on the Burlington Township side all we can say is that ^{the} face of the masonry presents a first class appearance but that the backing on this Abutment is not such as would come up to specifications for 2nd Class ^{Brick} masonry, and could only be classed as ordinary rubble masonry - Also we find that the foundation of the Wing Walls do not extend to the depth called for in plans which however might have been allowed by the Engineer - Nevertheless we consider this structure safe.
