To the Hon. the Judges of the Court
of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and
for the County of Clearfield.

The Petition of the undersigned,
inhabitants of the Township of
Pike, in said County, respectfully
sheweth: That a road hath been
long since laid out from near Hes.
Stevens, to public road at or near Mr. Peoples
Beginning at a point on the New Milport
road, thence through unimproved lands of
Levi Bloom and Henry Snyder N 54 $\frac{1}{2}$ E
30 $\frac{1}{2}$ Rods to a post, thence North 40 deg. East 28 $\frac{1}{2}$
Rods to a point on line of Henry Snyder & Levi
Bloom aforesaid, thence continuing same course
through unimproved land of Levi Bloom 40 $\frac{1}{2}$
Rods to post, thence
12 $\frac{1}{2}$ Rods to line of Jared Bloom, thence continuing
along said course through said lands (unimproved)
South 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ Rods to a point on line of Mr. Peoples
thence along said line N 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ deg. E 18 Rods
to a point on public road leading from
Bloomington to Olanta. Your Petitioners
conceive it now useless inconvenient and
unthensome to the inhabitants of said Town
by reason of the expense connected with the
opening of said road, which will incur from
\$300 to \$500 expense on the Tax payers of said

Township for the opening alone. Your petitioners
further represent that there can be a road
made and land occupied by the said Geo.
Starr within 2.0 Rods of the public road

and further that the said Geo. Starr does
not own any land in said township

Your petitioners therefore pray the
Court that the said road may be vacated
agreeably to the act of General assem-
bly in such cases made and provided;


We, the undersigned persons, appointed by
the within Order of Court, to view, and vacate the
Road therein mentioned, Respectfully report. That
having given notice of the time, and place of meeting,
according to the Act of Assembly. and being all present
at the view of the road proposed to be vacated, and being
all sworn, or affirmed, in pursuance of the said Order
of Court. We have viewed the following Road, to wit.
Beginning at the end of said road, at a point on the
line between Levi Bloom, and Henry Snyder, and running
through land of Henry Snyder, Levi Bloom, and J. J. Bloom.
North fifty five degrees east; Twenty nine perches to Pointers
North forty, and one half degrees east; Seventy perches. to
Pointers. North fifty degrees east; eighty eight perches.
North forty nine degrees east; Twenty perches to a Post in the
line between J. J. Bloom and William Peoples, thence between
them. North two and three quarter degrees east eighteen
and four tenth perches to the Township Road near William
Peoples house. Which said Road has been laid on spouty, wet
ground, and would be expensive to make. And we are of
opinion that said road is not necessary for public or private
use. And we therefore declare it vacant. a draft whereof is
hereunto attached. Witness our hands the 22^d day of Aug. 1890

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 6th day of

May, A. D. 1880, before Judges

of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in

said county, setting forth that a road has long

since been laid out from near George Stearn to public road at or near William Peoples Beginning at a point on the Newville road thence through unimproved land of Levi Bloom and Henry Dryden the several courses & distances to a point on a public road leading from Bloomsburg to Oshantin and said road is useless encumbered & burdensome to the inhabitants of said Township and that said road may be vacated agreeably to the act of assembly in such cases made & provided

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ the same according to law, to make report at Sept Term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint S J McElroy Henry Stearns Morris & Bell who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual ^{and if} viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.
T.P.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
