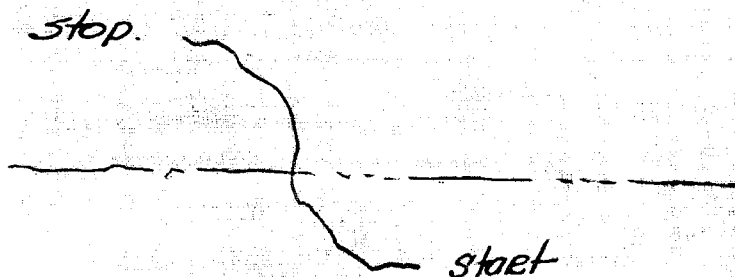

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 3rd day of May, A. D. 1890, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bell & Brady, in said county, setting forth that ~~they labor under~~

great inconvenience for want of a Public Road to lead from a point on Jacobie road leading from Daniel Myers in Bell Township to Lottsburgh at or near Senekunk Corner of Henry Grubbs land to intersect Public road leading from Rushes Grubbs mill to Shindlers Shop in Brady Township at a point at or near Mrs Grapes land

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law; Make report at next Term of Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Dora Reams, Daniel Grubbs & Adam Gould who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

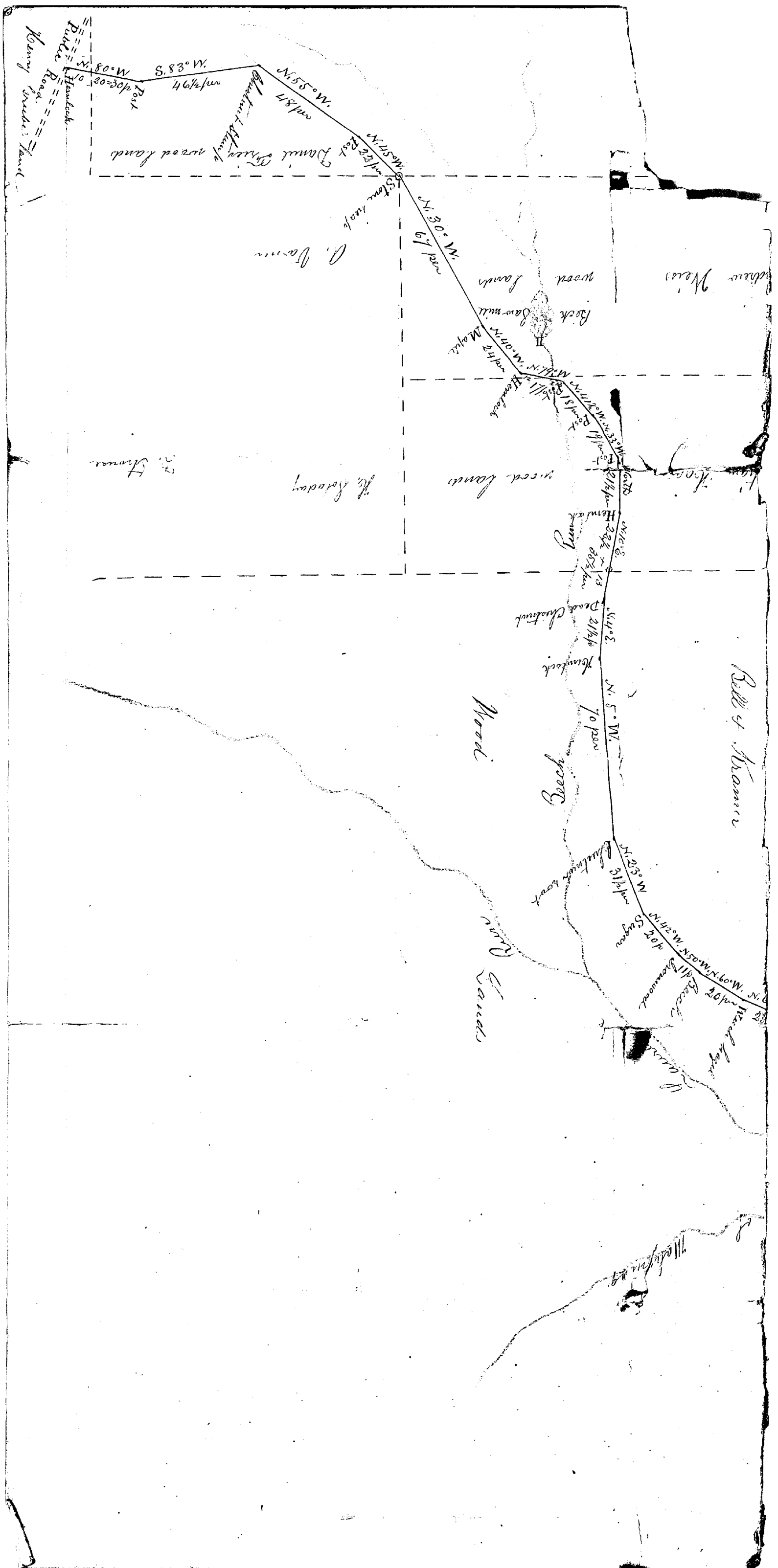
Beginning at a Hemlock Tree on Public road leading from

the south west corner of Henry Grube's land; Thence
through wood lands of Henry Grube N. 80° West 10 per
to line of lands of Daniel Frier, and through wood
lands of said Frier 20 per. more to a post;
Thence through said wood lands of said Frier
South 83° West 46½ perches to a chestnut stump; Thence
North 55 deg. W. 48 per. to a post; Thence North
45 deg. W. 23 per. to a stone heap corner of lands
of said Frier and Andrew Weirs; Thence through
wood lands of said Andrew Weirs North 30 deg. W.
67 per. to a Maple tree; Thence North 40 deg. W.
24 per. to a Hemlock Tree; Thence North 79 deg. West
12 per. to Beech run and 2 per more to line of lands of
Christian Haag and 3 per. more being 17 per to a
post on lands of said Christian Haag; Thence

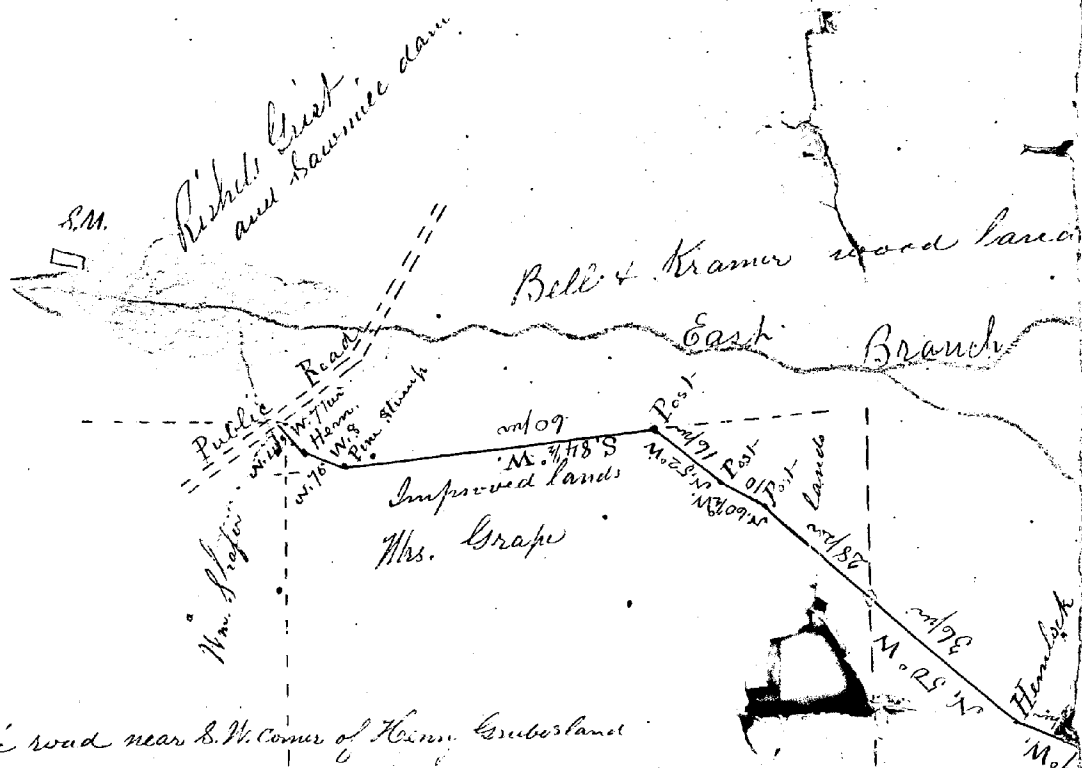

ployed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.
Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the
original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed
by the reviewers.
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to
damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as
the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
