At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 23d day of

December, A. D. 1880, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Beechard, in

said county, setting forth that they labor under

great inconvenience for want of a public road leading <sup>beginning at the Ruff Road Crossing</sup> from Muddy run to Agency Cross roads at a branch <sup>of</sup> Kemuel Root to a point in public road leading from cross roads to Jamesville between Shopp and Muddy run.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, And make report at May 1, 1891 whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint R. D. Entwistle, Geo. W. McNaugh, W. J. Flynn who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

## RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

We, the undersigned, viewers appointed in accordance with the within order to view  
and lay out the within aforesaid public road do hereby report, that due and suffi-  
cient notice having been given and having been duly affirmed according to  
law, we did upon the 4th and 7th days of May, A.D. 1891 view and lay out  
for public use a ~~public~~ road as described by the following course  
and distances, and we further find that for and in consider-  
ation of the advantages which will be derived by the owners of real  
along said line of road from the location of said road, &  
no damages are due any of said parties and it is the  
unanimous opinion of the undersigned viewers that none  
be granted. —

The courses & distances of said road to be as follows: Beginning  
at a point on the Dwp. road leading from New Dickison's to  
Hegartys Roads at or on the east side of railroad crossing, S 83° 07' P  
200 feet to a point on said road; thence N 64 1/2° W 276 feet to a post on  
the N.W. side of said road, being also terminal point of road lately lo-  
cated from Smoke Run Station to said point; thence N 49 1/2° W 326.5 feet to a  
point on Dwp. Road; thence N. 59 1/2° W 200.5 feet to a point on said Dwp. road;  
thence N 64 1/2° W 247 feet to a post on East side of said road, being also the  
beginning point of new road; thence as follows; all stations being marked  
by posts:

159 feet; N 86 1/2° W-276 feet; S 68° W-78 feet; S 18 1/2° W-107 feet;  
S 44 1/2° W-119.5 feet; S 68° W-270 feet; S 78 1/2° W-232.5 feet; S 66 1/2° W  
104 feet; S 40 1/2° W-410 feet; S 41 1/2° W-270 feet to connect with  
the road leading from Janesville to Hegartys Roads,  
at a point 796.7 feet from the crossing of said road  
by the Muddy Run Branch of the Tyrone Clearfield  
Railway.

We further recommend the above described route as  
being easy of construction, easily kept in repair, and  
without any heavy grades, and at a safe distance  
from the line of railroad.


