At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 7th day of June, A. D. 1880, before Judges of said Court, upon petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Dawson, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road to begin at the West End of the Bridge known as the Franklin Street Bridge & to intersect with the road leading to the road to Pennfield at or near the Richard Shaw & Dickey Homestead in Dawson & pray the Court to appoint proper persons to view the ground proposed for such road and lay out the same according to law and to Vacate the road now opened.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make report at next Term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Divers John McBride & George Gulich who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.


## Assessment of Damages.

To the honorable David L. Krebs President judge of the court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County Penna: We, the undersigned viewers appointed by the within order of court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notice of said roadview and met a agreeable thereto on Monday August 11 1890 and having been first severally sworn or affirmed we have viewed and do return for public use the following road to wit beginning at the end of Market Street Bridge in Lawrence Township at a point  $16\frac{1}{2}$  feet from the postguard rail on Northside of said Bridge thence north eighty five and three fourth degrees west three hundred fifty six feet (through land laid out for a street and taking a strip of land twenty six feet wide two hundred sixty feet long belonging to Frank Bradley) to a post at public road leading from Pennfield. We believe the road now in use should not be vacated as it is needed for a public road and therefore report against vacating the same. A plot or draft of road laid out is hereto annexed, which road as laid out is necessary in our opinion for a public road.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.  
Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the fact of their return. Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.  
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
