Petition for Review of  
Public Road in

Gaerwen Township

To the Honorable David L.Krebs, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County, Pa.

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of Lawrence Township in said County, respectfully represents: That a road hath lately been laid out by order of Court from a point on the road leading from Clearfield to Karthaus near the farm of R.S.Irvin to a point on road leading from Wolf Run to Mount Joy, which said road if opened would be very injurious to your petitioners and burdensome to the inhabitants of the township of Lawrence by reason of the expense of opening and maintaining said road. The said road will be only about 200 rods in length and cost at least \$300. to build; and by reason of passing through a low swampy ground, would be expensive <sup>to keep</sup> in repair. Your petitioners also aver that said road would be for the benefit of but one person in the township.

Your petitioners therefore pray your Honor to appoint proper *and vacate* persons to ~~view~~ said road and parts adjacent and make report to the next Court, and they will ever pray &c.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 22d day of

April, A. D. 1880, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Dawrence, in

said county, setting forth that a road leading

has lately been laid out by order of Court from a point on the road leading from Clearfield to Kunkle's near the farm of R. Dunn to a point on road leading from Wolf Run to Mount Joy which said road if opened would be very injurious to your petitioners and burdensome to the inhabitants of the top of Lawrence the said road will be only about 200 rods in length and cost at least \$300 to build & reason of passing through low swampy ground would be expensive to keep in repair and would be for the benefit of but one ~~person~~ in the Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ the same according to law, Make report to the Court whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Thos W. Moore Geo. H. Hall J. D. Dunn M. Pherson who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for said road, they shall proceed ~~to lay out~~ the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

## RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Rayviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the new viewers.

N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
