At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of September, A. D. 1890, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Union, in said county, setting forth that

the petitioners labor under great inconvenience from want of a road beginning at a road leading from Rockton to Clearfield at or near Spruce Hill & above house, thence by the nearest and best route until it intersects a public road at the house of Adam Korb in said township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint George B. Price, Henry Whitehead and Peter Beer who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

We the undersigned viewers appointed by the above order of Court to view  
and lay out the road therein mentioned respectfully report,

That having given due and public notice of the time and place of said  
view by printed handbills as required by the act of Assembly, we met at  
the time and place appointed, and after being duly sworn or affirmed  
according to law and all the viewers being present, we went upon  
the ground proposed for said view, and having viewed the same  
we report for Public use the following road to wit:—

Beginning at a pine stump in public road in front of Adam Korb's house  
Thence on line of lands of said Korb and Harley North  $86^{\circ}$  Deg. West Twenty-six  
(26) perches to a small maple; Thence through wood lands and improved lands  
of J. P. Huey South thirty-eight ( $38^{\circ}$ ) degrees West, Forty-five and a half ( $45\frac{1}{2}$ )  
perches to a post on line of lands of H. Fridley; Thence through improved  
lands & wood lands of said H. Fridley South Seventy ( $70^{\circ}$ ) degrees west, Fifty-  
six (56) perches to a post; Thence through improved lands of said  
Fridley South Five ( $5^{\circ}$ ) degrees west Fifty-six (56) perches and through  
wood lands of James Anderson twenty and a half ( $20\frac{1}{2}$ ) perches total  $76\frac{1}{2}$  per-  
ches to a post; Thence through woodlands of said James Anderson South  
sixty-four ( $64^{\circ}$ ) degrees west Twenty (20) perches to a Beech tree;  
Thence still through said wood lands of said Anderson South Seventy-six

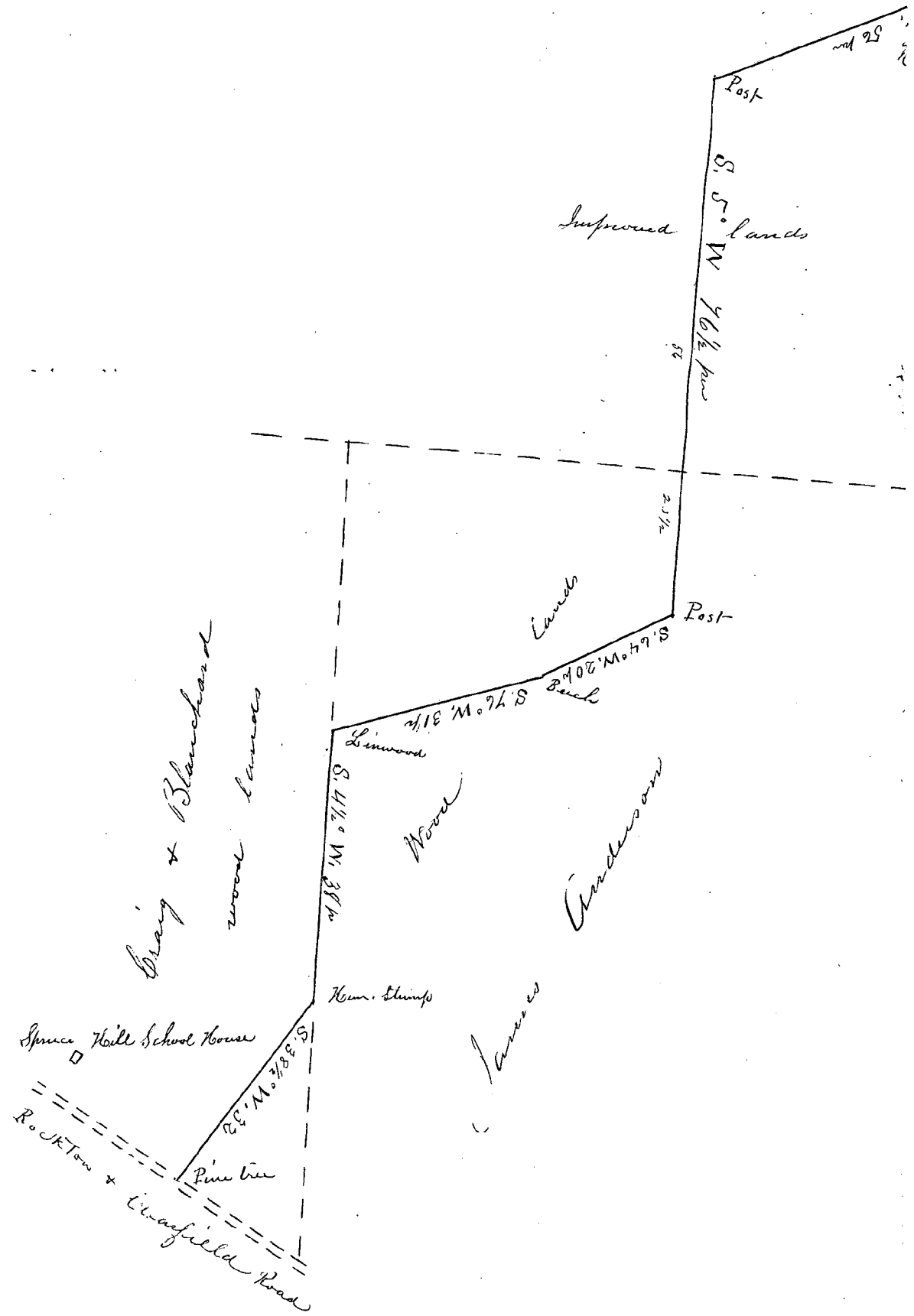

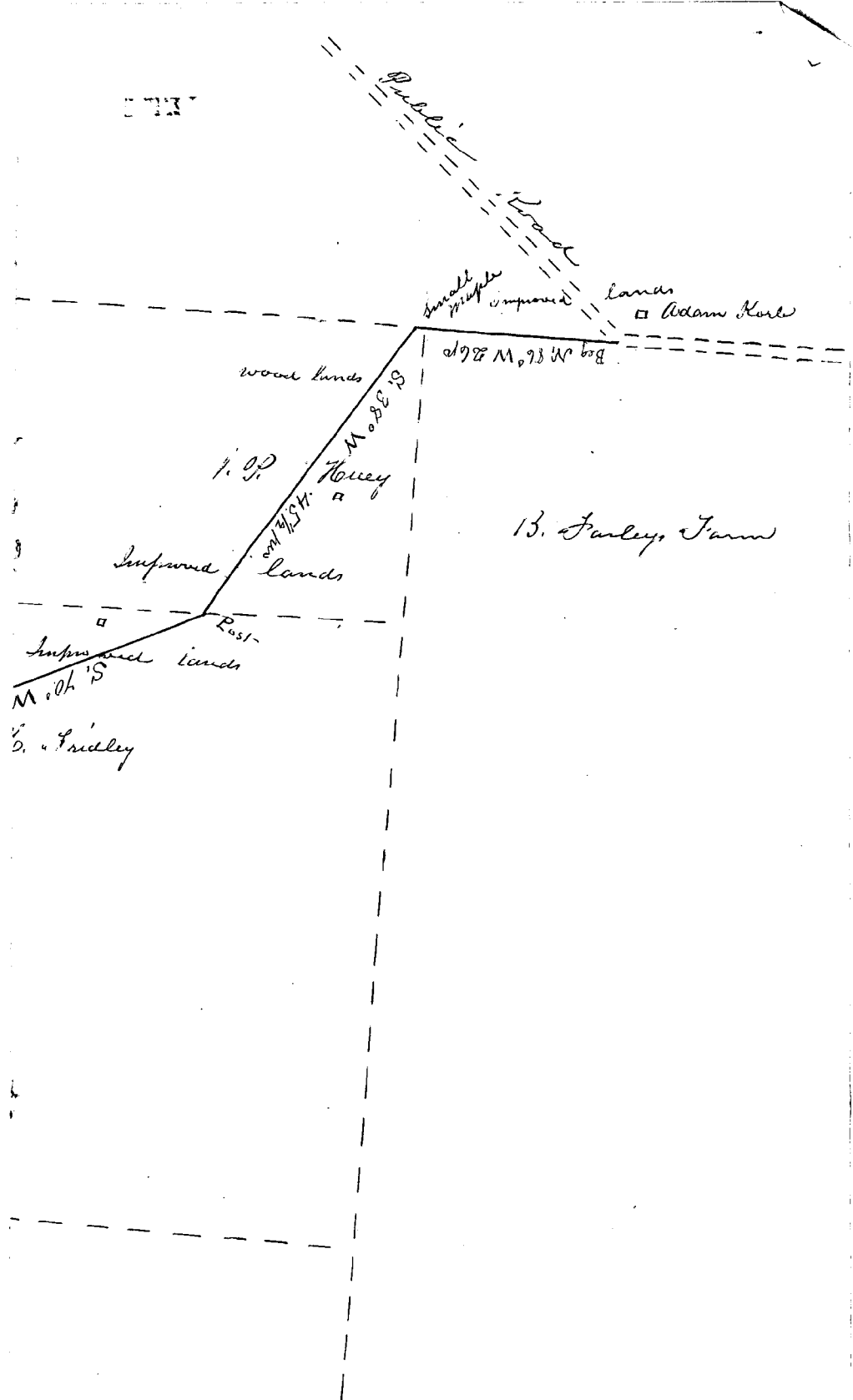
