

To the Honorable the Judges within named  
We the undersigned, persons appointed  
by the within order of Court, to view  
and lay out the road therein mentioned.  
Respectfully report, that having been  
present at the view of the ground  
proposed for such road, and having  
all been severally sworn or affirmed  
in pursuance of the said order, we  
have viewed and laid out, and do  
return for public use the following  
road to wit;

Beginning at J. W. Nales South East corner  
called Forest Street. Thence by Forest street  
and lands of John E. Dubois North Nineteen  
degrees West, Six Hundred and fifty four  
feet to John Smith. Thence North Three degrees  
East by same and W. J. Gordon & P. W. Rudolph  
land Eleven Hundred and fifty eight feet  
to com. corner of W. J. Gordon, P. W. Rudolph  
and Mary Mc Dermot. Thence North fifty-  
six degrees East through land of John E. Dubois  
Eight Hundred and twenty feet to line  
of Jas. Miller land. Thence North Three  
degrees East, by line of Jas. Miller and Geo. Minne  
Sixteen Hundred and fifty feet to a stake at  
the summit. Thence North Thirty two degrees  
West, through lands of John E. Dubois  
Three Hundred and thirty feet to a stake -

Thence North Forty two degrees west, Six Hundred and four feet to a stake. Thence, North - Seventy nine degrees west, Four hundred - and thirty eight feet to a stake. Thence - South Eighty one and one half degrees west. Three Hundred and eighty two feet to a stake. Thence North Seventy eight and one half degrees west, Five hundred and forty four feet to Road leading from Hetrick School House. A plat or draft of which is hereunto annexed. Which said road, so as aforesaid laid out we are of opinion is necessary for a Public Road. Witness our hands this Twenty fourth day of November a.d. 1890

Note.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.  
Also.—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.  
Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.  
N.B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Seventh day of July, A. D. 1880, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Dandy, in said county, setting forth that they labor under

Great inconvenience for want of a Public Road at a point near John W. Nales to the Public Road leading northward to the School School House at a point between said School house and land of Mrs. Hannah Jane Lycick

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. L. Vosburg, J. P. Taylor and James G. Harris who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
