The Petition of W A Jones having been presented setting forth that he is engaged in lumbering on certain lands in Union Township and that for the purpose of transporting his lumber and bark it becomes necessary to open a Road through the unimproved land of one H M Best situate in said Township. Consisting of About one hundred (100) Acres and failing to agree with the owner asking the Court to Appoint Viewers to Assess damages if any whereupon the Court Appoint Joseph Schofield Henry Bloom & Henry Whitehead who after giving five days personal notice to H M Best shall proceed to View & Assess the damages if any Considering the Advantages and disadvantages to Accrue & make report thereof to the Court.

M. Best, a distance of 105 Rods, said Road averaging about Eleven feet in width.

Finding the adjoining land, overgrown with underbrush, thin of soil and stoney: - We have decided, that H. M. Best - Is not entitled to any damages, by reason thereof.

damages if any sustained by the owner of
a certain piece of land claimed by one B. M.
Best by reason of the construction of a road
by him through for the purpose of transport-
ing lumber and bark, now if the said W. A.
Jones shall pay or cause to be paid to the owner
of said land, all damages which may be as-
sessed and awarded by the jury together with
together with such costs as may be decreed as
against the petitioner then this obligation to be
void otherwise to be and remain in full force and
virtue: Witness our hands & seals day & year aforesaid.
