To the Honorable David S. Krebs President  
Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield  
Co. Pa, we the undersigned viewers appointed by the  
within order of court to view and lay out the road  
therin mentioned respectfully report, that we gave  
good and lawful notice of said road view as required  
by the <sup>Supreme</sup> Court and met agreeable thereto on Nov 22 1890  
and having both been present and having been first  
severally sworn or affirmed we have laid out and do  
return for public use the following road to wit: Beg-  
inning at a point in Public road at land of David  
Copeland thence by said road north forty two degrees  
east two hundred and fifty eight feet to a point in road  
thence through lands of John Marles (end next public  
road being  $16\frac{1}{2}$  feet from his yard fence) north forty four and one  
half degrees west ~~four~~ <sup>feet</sup> hundred forty ~~feet~~ <sup>feet</sup> and ~~one~~ <sup>three</sup> tenth  
perches <sup>feet</sup> to a post in swamp on line of John Marles and Cor-  
ner of Thos Edgar and John Bartley. Then the same course  
sixteen and one half feet from fence of lots on left seven  
hundred forty two and five tenth perches to a post thence  
North six and three fourth degrees East three hundred  
sixteen and five tenth perches to a post thence continuing  
through land of John Hartley North twenty nine degrees East  
six hundred and five feet to a post, hence north thirty five  
degrees East four hundred and eighteen <sup>feet</sup> perches to a pine  
stump thence north thirty nine and three fourth degrees east  
five hundred forty one feet to a post on Decatur Township  
line thence through land of David F. legal in Morris Township  
North nineteen and three fourth degrees West six hundred  
and fifty feet to a post thence North thirty five and one half  
degrees East six hundred and thirteen feet to a post thence  
North thirty one east one hundred and eighty six feet to  
a post thence North thirty nine and one fourth degrees  
East nine hundred thirty feet to point in road from  
Wallacetown to Philipsburg at end of lane in land of  
David F. legal, a plot or draft of which road as laid  
out aforesaid is hereto annexed showing courses  
distances and improvements which road is nec-  
essary in our opinion for a public road. Witness

Reviewers cannot, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers, interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 22d day of September, A. D. 1820, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Deeration, in said county, setting forth that they have under great inconvenience for want of a road beginning at a publice road leading from Graham section to Morrisdale on the land of David Copeland thence nearest and best route until it intersects a publice road leading from Philipsburg to Wallacetown on the land of David Higgin in said Township.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make report at next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Myers David Gearhardt Jacob Dimelij who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
