At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Tenth day of December, A. D. 1891, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Graham, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under great inconvenience for want of a road or highway to lead from Jeremiah Keyler to intersect the Graham Township road at or near Amos Hubler

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make Report at next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Dyer, Geo. Cable & H. C. Dale who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

and having been first severally sworn or affirmed
we have viewed and laid out and do return for

thence by a road now in use South forty two and
one half degrees East forty two and four tenth perches
thence South forty eight and one half degrees East eleven
and five tenth perches to line between Jeremiah Ryler land
and Benj Spackman's thence by said line south eighty five and
one half degrees East forty seven and six tenth perches
to point near Palestine School house thence through
land of Benjamin Spackman South fifteen degrees West
thirty two and seven tenth perches thence South nine
and one fourth degrees West twenty two and eight tenth
perches to point in said road near Benjamin Spackman's
house thence South fifty seven and three fourth
degrees East (crossing run at + 19.7 thence on land of R.C. Hoover)
forty six perches to post thence South forty nine degrees East
ten perches to post on line between Amos Hubler's and R.C. Hoover's
land thence by said line South three degrees fifty minutes
West eighty three perches to Township road near Amos
Hubler's. A plot or draft of which road as laid out
aforesaid is herewith annexed showing courses distance
and improvements. Which road is necessary in our
