RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, the undersigned, owners of lands through which the road located by the viewers, under the annexed order, passes, for and in consideration of the sum of ONE DOLLAR to us respectively paid by the County of Clearfield at and before the ensealing and delivery hereof, have remised, released and forever quit-claimed, and do hereby remise, release and forever quit-claim to the said County of Clearfield all damages that may arise to us respectively by reason of the location and opening of the said road, so that neither we nor any of us, nor any person claiming under us, can or may hereafter ask, sue for, demand, have or receive any damages for injuries arising or growing out of the location and opening of the road aforesaid.


At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Eight day of October, A. D. 1880, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Declin, in said county, setting forth that

they have been unable to make a public road or highway to lead from a point in the Township road leading from mouth of Muddy Run to Janevile at or near the Huddy Run School House in said Township to some point on Madine Branch of T. C. Run in said Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~make up~~ make up ~~at~~ at ~~next~~ next ~~term~~ term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Henry Dyer Anthony Flynn John McAll who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

To The Honorable David L. Krebs President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County Pennsylvania,
we, the undersigned, viewers appointed by the within order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned respectfully report: That we gave good and lawful notice of said road view and met agreeable thereto on Thursday the sixth day of November A.D. 1890 and having been severally sworn or affirmed we have viewed and laid out and do return for public use the following road to wit: Beginning at a post on the South side of road leading from mouth of Muddy Run to Jamesville about eight rods from Muddy Run School House. Thence through woodland of John Beyer South sixty-one and one half degrees west seven hundred forty-two feet to a post about four rods South of Muddy Run. Thence through woodland of said John Beyer and C. C. Ball South forty-two degrees west five hundred fifty-six feet to a post hence through unimproved land of C. C. Ball and a cross right of way of Madera branch of Monroe & Clearfield R.R. south sixty-five and one fourth degrees west one hundred and thirty-eight and nine tenth feet to a post fifty feet from centre of main track of Railroad, a plot or draft of which road so as aforesaid laid out is hereto annexed showing courses, distances and improvements which road is in our opinion necessary for a public road. Note.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Boviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.
N.B.—If the viewers believe that the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
