At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 12th day of May, A. D. 1887, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Begler & Beebe, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway to lead from a point on the public road after near the line of Begler & Kirk in Begler Township to a point on the public road leading from Kegartys X Roads to Glen Hope at or near the dwelling house of Fred Shoff in Beebe Township.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make report at next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint R. M. Entmeyer, Joseph Alexander, and Annie Bode who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

To the Honorable David L. Knebs, Prost Judge out of Quarters sessions of Clearfield Co., Pa. We the undersigned, viewers appointed in accordance with within order, do respectfully report, that after due and sufficient notice we met upon the 17th day of July, 1891, and after having been duly affirmed, proceeded to examine various routes supposed to be feasible for the location of within road; and we further report that then and upon subsequent days we decided, unanimously, upon the location as hereinafter described; with the allowance of one hundred dollars damage to Saint Regarty for the use of certain improved land owned by him.

The various courses and distances of said road are as follows, and we recommend the laying out and opening of a public road upon the same.

that part of the road falls in Beccaria township


That the citizens presenting this petition are

it unnecessary and impracticable.


They therefore remonstrate against the granting
