I estimate the fence at fifty cents a rod. That to include only labor of building. I estimate the material to be worth fifty cents per rod, that would make the fence cost one dollar a rod. I refer to a wire fence but Mr Bues has no wire fence on his farm.

Walter, D. Shury Sworn before me in Bradford Township. I am acquainted with the farm near John Bues's farm. And know about where this proposed road will run this road will cut up the fields and leaves them in bad shape.

for farming it runs angular through them. If it went through a place of mine in the same shape I would consider the damages worth over hundred and seventy five dollars as it cuts the upper part of the fields off from the other so that you cannot get up or down with grain or anything. It will be necessary to keep this land fenced in order to farm it successfully.

7th 1891 John Bueser, ^{Senior} Resident in Bradford Twp
Owns one hundred and fifty acres, this
proposed road from Dixon's ford to Public
road at Jerome Wilsons, runs through my
fields about seventy three rods this road
as laid out runs twenty six rods straight
and then turns; it leaves one three cornered piece
Containing about three quarters of an acre
on one side and on the other side, leaves a
piece twenty six rods long, about ten rods
wide at one end and thirteen at the other
end. Where the road makes the turn the
other field it makes a three cornered piece
I do not know how much it contains
Taking in the consideration of the prices
to build and the amount of land taken
by the road I consider it worth about
One hundred and fifty dollars.

There is one hundred and forty six
rod of fence to build I cannot
use the fields without fencing.

Cross Examination by J. G. Harris Esq

The road is made crooked in order to get
a grade. The hill is too steep to make a good
road straight. There is about one hundred
rod of this road that I would use. That part
of the road would be a benefit to Mr. I
might use the other end of the road if it was
a public road. My fences are all rail
fences. I can't fix any price for fencing.
I made no calculation. One field is
a pasture field, and the other a wheat field
One field is clear of stumps the other is
not, it is stony ground, I estimate the
damages at One hundred and fifty dollars
without any calculation. I did not take
into consideration the advantages of a public
road to Mr.

Redirect. In some places there will be a side
cut of from three to four feet. I would
have to build a new fence.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 9th day of December, A. D. 1891, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bradford, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway in the Township of Bradford to begin at a point in the public road leading from All Bucks to Orono, crossing and extending thence to a point on the public road in another public road leading from Jerome Hillman to Shawsville

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and make report at next whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers Isaac Nelson Edward Long who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
