Pennsylvania, we the undersigned viewers appointed  
by the within order of court to view, vacate and supply the  
road herein mentioned respectfully report that we gave  
good and lawful notice of said road view with notice  
to County Commissioners and met agreeable <sup>on</sup> time  
to on December 1<sup>st</sup> and having been first severally sworn  
or affirmed, the undersigned Joseph Owens and Harry Byers  
having been present we have viewed and laid out the  
following road to wit Beginning at a point on Public road near  
a house of Ellis Drinn Thence through land of Ellis Drinn  
North sixty four and three fourth degrees East four and Thir-  
ty seven hundredth perches to a post thence North Thirty seven  
degrees East seven and eight tenth perches to a pine thence  
North Thirty five and one half degrees East eight and four  
tenths perches to a pine stump thence North twenty seven degrees  
forty minutes East six and six tenth perches to a Black Oak  
thence North Thirty one degrees East fifteen and nine tenth  
perches to a post thence North Thirty one degrees East  
sixteen and two tenth perches to a post thence  
North forty three and one half degrees East twenty one and two tenth  
perches to a Walnut thence North fifty three and one four th  
degrees East eight and two tenth perches to a pine stump thence  
North fifty nine and one half degrees East eight and seven-  
ty six hundredth perches to point in Public road at narrow  
near Mitchell Shope's field which road is in our opinion neces-  
sary for a public road and is laid out to take the place  
of the following road which is low and occasionally washed out  
by high floods. Beginning at end of road laid out thence South for-  
ty six and one fourth degrees West sixteen and two tenth perches  
thence South thirty nine degrees Thirty five minutes West two-  
ty five and one tenth perches thence South twenty nine and one  
half degrees West eight and four tenth perches thence South  
Thirty four degrees West forty eight and four tenth perches  
thence south forty seven and three fourth degrees West  
five and sixty eight hundredth perches thence South eighty  
six and one half degrees West, six and fourteen hundredth  
perches to Beginning of road laid out which road is in our  
opinion useless & inconvenient and burdensome and there  
fore should be vacated. A plot or draft of which road  
as laid out and vacated is hereto annexed showing course  
distances and improvements. We believe road owner of land  
through which the road <sup>passes</sup> is entitled to damages by reason of  
locating and opening said road. Witness our hands this

N. B. If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of Sept, A. D. 1891, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Goshen, in said county, setting forth that

they labor under great inconvenience by reason of high water on that part of the Turn road from near the mouth of Lick Run to the lower end of the narrow near Mitchell Shope's field - which has become impracticable to repair or keep in order. ~~and pray your honor to appoint proper~~

Vacate & Supply  
and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~and make report to the Court~~  
whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers John Saucy & Joe Cuccia who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, ~~Vacating Supplying~~ they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
