

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 9th day of

September, A. D. 1881, before Judges of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Jordan —, in

said county, setting forth that a public road was laid out from Paxton Settlement to a point on public road at a mean residence of Price Mays that a portion of said road extending from line of Tycoaster Cuvys land to a point on public road at a mean Price Mays is inconvenient & burdensome Wherefore pray the Court to appoint Commissioners to view & supply that portion of said road extending from Cuvys to Price Mays

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make report at next Term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. McLeskey and Ferguson Robert Moon who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do least injury to private property, and state particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.



having given notice of the time, and place
of Meeting, according to the act of assem-
bly, and being all present, at the view of
the Road proposed to be Vacated, and
Supplied. And being all sworn or affirmed
in pursuance of the said Order of Court,
we have viewed the Road mentioned in the
said order, and find that in our opinion
that part of said Road as shown on the
annexed draft, in Red Ink, and which runs
through a part of Sylvester Burny's land
and land of Abram Bloom, and near
his Buildings, is unnecessary, and incon-
venient, and we declare it Vacant, as shown
by the red lines, on the annexed draft: Viz.
Beginning at a point where the said
Road leaves the tract line between the
said Sylvester Burny, and James McReekan's
land, and runs ^{through} the land of Burny, and
Abram Bloom, North Seven Degrees east
Thirty-four perches, North five degrees

in mentioned respectively report.


That having given Notice of the Time
and Place of Meeting, according to the Act
of Assembly, and being all present at the
View of Road proposed to be Vacated and
Supplied, and being all sworn or affirmed,
we have Viewed, and Vacated that part of
said Road as shown in red Ink on the an-
nexed Draft: And Supplied that part of
said Road Vacated, as follows. Beginning
at a Point in the Township Road near the residence
of Price Mays. And running through land of
Abram Bloom South Seventy One degrees East
Twenty Seven perches to a Post. Thence South Nine
degrees East. Three perches to a Post. Thence in
said Bloom's land. South forty four degrees
West fourteen and four tenths perches to a Post
in line of Price Mays. Thence along the line bet-
ween him and the said Bloom, and between the
said Abram Bloom, and James McKeehan. And
James McKeehan and Sylvester Curry, South
Thirty eight and a half degrees East One
hundred, and four tenths perches to a Post in

the Township Road to "Patterson's School House" which said road as above described we are of opinion is necessary for public use. A Plot or draft whereof is hereto affixed. And we are of opinion that no person through whose land said road passes is entitled to receive any damage.
