We, the undersigned, Viewers appointed by the Annexed Order of Court. to View, and vacate the Road therein mentioned. Respectfully report: That having given notice of the time, and place of meeting. According to the Act of Assembly, And being all present at the View of The road proposed to be vacated, and being all sworn, or Affirmed, in pursuance of The Said Order; We have viewed the said road. As follows. Beginning at a point in the Anderson Creek Road where the two roads intersect. And running through land of N. E. Arnold and Christian Buck. North fifty one and a half degrees west. Thirty perches. North fifty degrees west. Fifteen perches. North Eighty six and a half degrees west. Twelve and three tenths perches. South Sixty and a half degrees West. Seven and five tenths perches. South Thirty nine and a quarter degrees west. fifty two and five tenths perches. South forty seven. degrees west. Eight; and eight tenths perches. South Ten degrees west. Eight and seven tenths perches. South five degrees west. nineteen and six tenths perches. South twenty degrees west. nineteen and three tenths perches. South Thirty degrees west. Thirty one and six tenths

Perches. Thence South fifty seven degrees west twenty two and four tenths perches. South fifty three degrees west. Twenty one, and one tenth perches. South forty six and three quarter degrees west. At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 6th day of January, A. D. 1892, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bloom

, in said county, setting forth that

A road has been long since laid out leading from the public road known as the Cream Hill turnpike on land of Christian Buck to a road known as the Creek road along Anderson Creek, which said road your petitioners conceive is now useless inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants of said township Your petitioners pray the Court said road may be vacated

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, And Report to Next Term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint S F McCloskey, H B Thompson Henry Kerns who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
