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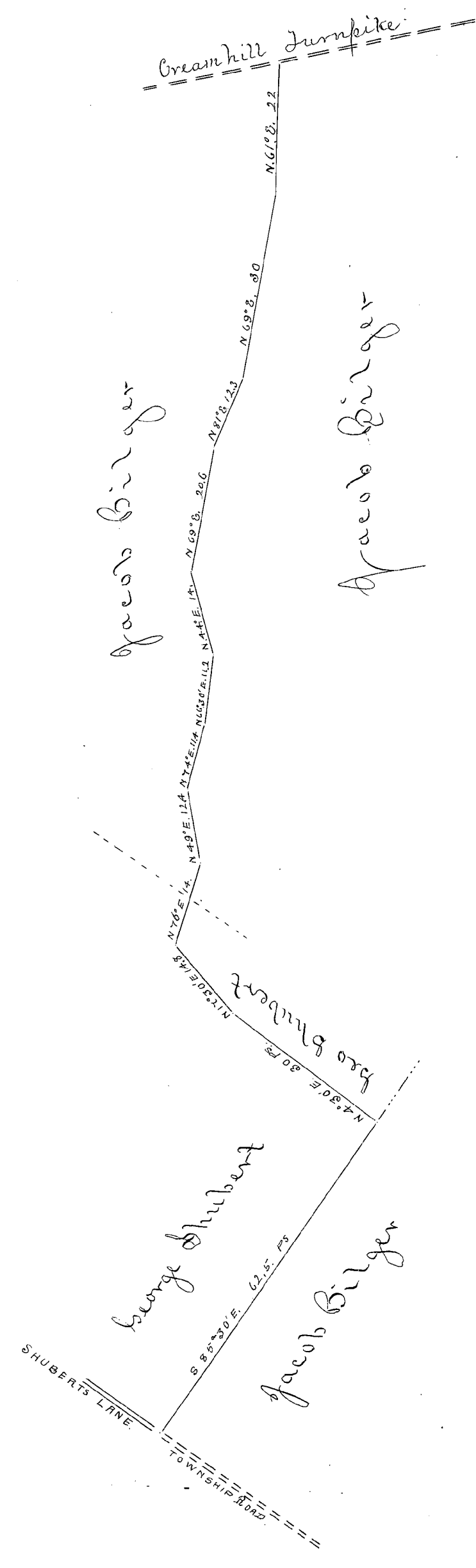
To the Hon. Judge of the Court of quarter
Sessions of Clearfield County Pa.

We the undersigned persons appointed
by the annexed order of Court. to view
and vacate the Road therein mentioned
respectfully report. That having given
notice of the time, and place of meeting,
according to the act of assembly, and being
all present at the view of the road propo-
sed to be vacated. And being all Sworn, or
affirmed, in pursuance of the said Order
of Court. We have viewed the said road ^{which}
is described as follows. Viz: Beginning at
the end of Shuberts Lane, and thence along
the line between George Shuberts and Jacob Bilger
South eighty five and a half degrees East, fifty
two and five tenths perches, thence through land
of said Shuberts North four and a half degrees
East Thirty perches, North seventeen degrees
and a half East. Fourteen and eight tenths perches, North
Seventy Six degrees East. Fourteen perches. Thence
through land of Jacob Bilger, North forty
nine degrees East. Twelve and four tenths per-
ches. North seventy four degrees East. Eleven
and four tenths perches. North sixty Six
and a half degrees East. Eleven and two
perches. North forty four degrees East.

Fourteen perches. North Sixty nine degrees East;
Twenty and six tenths perches. North Eighty one
degrees East; Twelve and Three tenths perches. North
Sixty nine degrees East. Thirty perches. Thence
South Sixty one degrees East. Twenty Two per-
ches to the Cream Hill Turnpike in land of
Jacob Bilger in Bloom Township. A plot or
Graf of which is herewith annexed. Which
said road, as above described we are of opinion
is not necessary for public use, and we there-
fore declare it Vacated.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 6th day of January, A. D. 1892, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bloom

, in said county, setting forth that

That a road has been long since laid out leading from the public road known as Cream Hill turnpike on the lands of Jacob Bilyer to the road known as Shubuts ^{lane} in said township of Bloom which road your petitioners conceive is now become useless burdensome and inconvenient to the inhabitants of said township your petitioners pray the Court that said road may be vacated

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, And report to next term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint S. F. W. Closter, H. B. Thompson Henry Kerns who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
