To the Honorable David R. Krebs, President Judge of said
Court.

We, the undersigned persons appointed by the
hereto attached order of court to view and lay
out the road therein mentioned, respectfully re-
port.

That having given due notice to the in-
dividual owners of the land over which said
road passes of the time and place of meeting of said
viewers, and that having given due notice of the time
and place of said road view by having notices
posted along the route of said proposed road for
a period of not less than five days prior to the
meeting of said viewers; and that having given
due notice to the County Commissioners of Clear-
field County of the time of place of said road view,
and meeting as per notices on the 27th day
of December 1892, the following viewers being
present, to wit, Willis J. Nugent, W. W. McDowell
and Samuel Sunderland and having
all been first severally sworn or affirmed, we
have laid out and do return for public use
the following road, a draft of which is
hereto attached.

Beginning at a post on South Side of Public Road
leading from McHaffey's Saw Mill, in Bell Township,
Clearfield County (~~Samuel Sunderland~~)

to Pursuantoney, Jefferson county, near the residence of Asaph C. Sunderlin, thence through unimproved arable land of A.C. Sunderlin, South eighteen and one half degrees East twenty nine perches to a dead hemlock, thence by same South thirty two and one half degrees East five and one half perches to a post corner, thence along line between Clemons Miller and Fred. Hockenberry, through unimproved lands, South thirty two and one half degrees East, forty seven and one half perches to a post corner, thence along line between Sylvester Rich and C.C. Frampton. through lands, part of which is unimproved and part cleared, South twenty four and one half degrees East forty five perches to a maple corner, thence along line between C.C. Frampton and William Montgomery through cleared arable lands ~~thirteen~~ South twenty four and one half degrees East thirteen perches to a post corner, thence through unimproved woodland of Silas F. Brady South twenty four and one half degrees East, three perches to a post, South twenty degrees West twenty perches, and South twenty four degrees West eighteen and eight tenths perches to a post, thence through unimproved land of Adella P. Dfert the following courses and distances; South twenty nine degrees West, fourteen perches; South twenty degrees West four perches; South eleven degrees West twelve perches; South thirty two degrees West eighteen perches and South twenty seven and one half degrees West seventeen perches, thence through land of Robt. McHaffey (unimproved land) South eighteen degrees West six perches to a post, thence through woodland along line between Robert McHaffey and M.J.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 7th day of December, A. D. 1892, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bell

, in said county, setting forth that

They labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway leading from a point on the public road leading from Mahaffey said mill in Bell Township Clearfield Co to Pennsbutany in Jefferson County at or near the residence of Asaph Junduler in Bell Township to a point on a public road leading from Mahaffey through to Pennsbut at or near the residence of Christian Beatz in said Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make report at May 1893

whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Miller, August W. H. McQuinn, James Junduler who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
