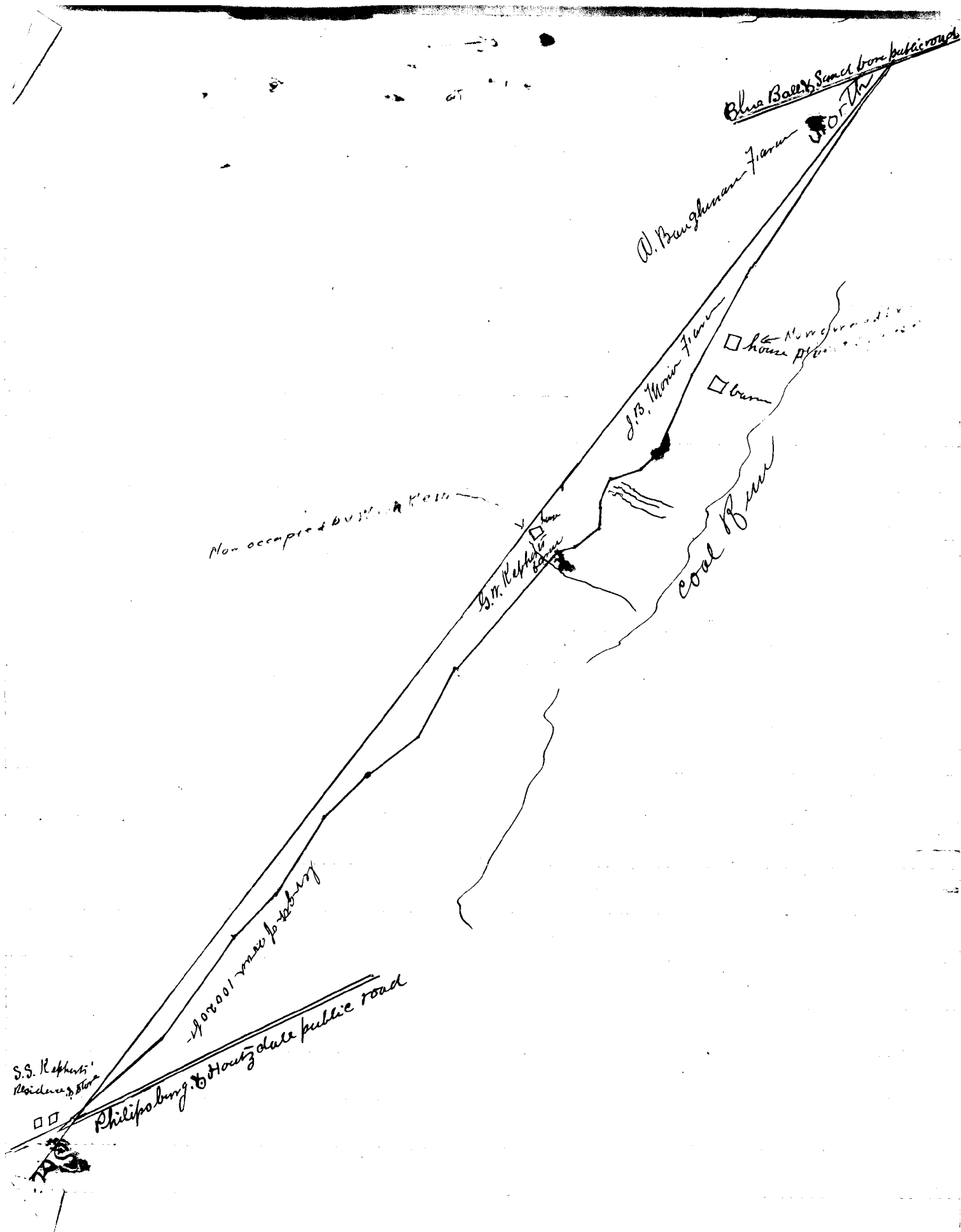
At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 15th day of March, A. D. 1892, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Deedus, in said county, setting forth that

They have much great inconvenience for want of a public road to lead from a point on the Blue Ball & Tanbarn public road at or near property of Estate of Samuel Baughman deceased to a point on the Philipsburg & Houtzdale road at or near the property of S. S. Keppert

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, *Make report at Sept 25 1892* whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint *W. H. Baughman John W. Keizer Burton Munter* who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

We the Subscribers, the persons appar-
-nted by the said Court to view and
lay out the road therein mentioned report
that having been first severally sworn or aff-
-irmed in the manner and form preser-
-ibed by the said order that all of us O. H.
Baughman, John W. Kizer and Burton White
having viewed the ground for the proposed
road and all of us concurring did lay out
and now return the same for a public road beginning
at a point on Blue Ball and Sandborn public road
and running through lands of A. Baughman (Des.) South 13
East to lands of J. B. Marin. One Thousand Eight Hundred and twenty
feet (1820 ft) and thence through lands of J. B. Marin passing his
farm house and bore a South East course to lands of G. W.
Kephart. Three Thousand Eight Hundred and thirty feet
(3830 ft) and thence through lands of G. W. Kephart, South End
one Thousand and eighty feet ^(1080 ft) to lands of Morgan D.
Hale and thence through lands of Morgan & all & Co.
to lands G. W. Kephart. Four Hundred and fifty feet
(450 ft) and thence through lands of G. W. Kephart and
S. S. Kephart, South East, to Philipstburgh and
Houtzdale public road near residence and
stone of S. S. Kephart Two Thousand Eight
Hundred and thirty two feet (2832 ft) making
the total length of viewed road Ten Thousand

and twenty feet (10020 ft) We the viewers have endeavored
to place this road on the best ground and with as little
gravel as possible and feel satisfied that it will be a great
improvement on the old road, as it lessens the
gravel and will be possible at all seasons of
the year. The old road becomes impossible through
the winter months on account of snow drifts.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return.
Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
