To the HONORABLE DAVID L. KREBS, PRESIDENT JUDGE of the said Court.

The petition of the undersigned citizens of the Township of Beccaria, in said County, respectfully sheweth:-

That two petitions were presented to your Honor asking for the appointment of viewers to lay out &c. a road from a point near Mathews' School House in said Township of Beccaria to a point near Chest Township Line.

That the petition purporting to be signed by the citizens of Beccaria Township, contains no names of said citizens, but contains the names of all the Business Men of Coalport; and the other petition contains the names of only fifteen citizens of said Township, only six of whom are owners of real estate.

That the object of the petitions is to create a new road from Westover to Coalport; that there now exists a good and sufficient road between these two towns, by way of Irvona--of easy grade, easy to keep in repair, and only slightly longer than the proposed road would be.

That the object of the citizens of Coalport in signing this petition is, evidently, to have the citizens of the Township of Chest to come to Coalport direct, without having to pass the stores at Irvona, where they now stop to make their purchases, and for this purpose alone the road might be useful.

That there are no citizens living upon the line of the proposed road.

That a road, long existing, between these same points, and

deemed to be useless and burdensome, has recently been vacated by your Honor. That the road so vacated was travelled by but few, was kept in partial repair at an enormous expense to the said Township, was entirely through unimproved woodland of such a character as to make the opening of a good road impracticable, and was and is of such a grade as to be dangerous.

That a road between these points can only be made at an expense of Four Thousand Dollars or more, which the said Township, already burdened with taxes, and having several new roads to open, is unable to bear. That if the proposed road is made as short as the one recently vacated, the grade will exceed that allowed by law, and if extended to lessen the grade, it will be as long as the road above mentioned by way of Irvona.

Your petitioners, therefore, not presuming to dictate, but believing that the proposed road is useless and "not necessary" and the opening of the same would impose a great hardship upon the said Township of Beccaria would pray your Honor to refuse to confirm the view made, and they will ever pray &c.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September, A. D. 1891, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Beccaria Chick, in said county, setting forth that

The labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway to begin at or near Matthews School House in the Township of Beccaria along public road leading from Oureport to St Lawrence Canine Co and extending thence to a point near Chick Township line from St Lawrence Canine Co to Westover Clearfield Co

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, W make report at next Term of Court whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Wade H. Harty Enoch Westover Ed. Rickert who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
