At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 6th day of Sept, A. D. 1892, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Woodward, in said county, setting forth that

for want of a public Township road to begin at a point at the western terminal of Main Street in the Borough of Hoytdale Pa and ending at a point on the Public township road leading from Hoytdale to Quinsville or or near W.C. Davis's Store in Woodward Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law,

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint A Sa Spence, W E Ulrich & P Gales who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

We the Undersigned appointed to view the  
road within mentioned Report, that in pursuance  
of said order having been severally sworn as  
herein directed and after the accustomed two days  
notices <sup>unless having given the County Commissioner notice as required by law</sup> having given  
believe the said road to be necessary for the welfare  
of all concerned for the following reasons; 1<sup>st</sup> at the  
present time there is but one mode of ingress and egress  
from the Western end of the Town of Hollydale and  
that this means is entirely insufficient owing to the amount  
of heavy traffic and from the fact that the present road  
is not standard width being considerably less than  
30 feet; 2<sup>nd</sup> that the said road will be inexpensive  
in that it will be much safer for pedestrians and those  
driving light vehicles & that it will cost little in  
working to maintain roadway after construction;  
5<sup>th</sup> that the damages will be comparatively nothing  
Considering the amount of benefit to those living  
or near the proposed route. Therefore we the  
Undersigned viewers do set forth and state that the  
road as shown by the draught herein attached for a  
public road is an absolute necessity to the tax  
payers of Woodward Township living on or  
near said road and that it will be the greatest  
relief to travelling public in paying for said

PUBLIC SPIRIT PRINT.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.  
Also—Reviewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Reviewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the reviewers.  
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
