At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 5th day of September, A. D. 1892, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Sandy

, in said county, setting forth that

They labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road to begin in a public road leading from DuBois to Sabula at a point about three hundred feet north of W.R. Railroad Crossing on land of A. A. Burrow in the Township of Sandy and to end in said public road leading from DuBois to Sabula at a point on West line between John E. DuBois & Said A. A. Burrow opposite road leading from Shaffer leading to New Salem in said Sandy Township & pray the Court to appoint Viewers to view the ground proposed and if they should see occasion to lay out the same to enquire and Vacate the public road now opened from the intersection of road leading from New Salem to Shaffer leading with the road from DuBois to Sabula at the end of proposed new road 300 feet north of the W.R. Crossing in case of A. A. Burrow and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, Make report at next Term whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Geo. C. Kirk J. A. Daly J. P. Taylor who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.

RELEASE OF DAMAGES.

ASSESSMENT OF DAMAGES.

The following persons, having refused to release the damages to which they respectively may be entitled by reason of the location and the opening of the said road in the annexed return described, we, the undersigned viewers, under oath in pursuance of our duty, under the Act of Assembly, do assess their damages and make report thereof, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Judge within named: We the undersigned, appointed by the aforesaid order do report; That in pursuance thereof, after having been severally duly sworn according to law, all the viewers appointed by said order, viewed the ground proposed for the within mentioned road, and we do agree that there is occasion for a road as desired by thy petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road, we have laid out in such manner as shall, in our opinion, do the least damage, or injury to private property, and as far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described road, to wit: - Beginning at a post in the public road leading from Dubois to Sabula, on the line between lands of J. E. Dubois on the west, and H. A. Berwin, Trustee, on the east, thence N. $21\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. on said line, one hundred and Ninety-seven (197) feet to a post; thence N. $78\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. on lands of said Berwin, one hundred and ten and a half (110 $\frac{1}{2}$) feet to a post; - thence still on lands of said Berwin, S. $86\frac{3}{4}$ ° E., one thousand and fifty-seven (1057) feet to a post; - thence N. $52\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., still on lands of said Berwin, one thousand and sixty-one (161) feet, to a post in said road leading from Dubois to Sabula. We further report that we have inquired and do vacate the following described public road, to wit: - Beginning at a post in the public road leading from Dubois to Sabula, in the line of lands of J. E. Dubois and H. A. Berwin, aforesaid; - thence N. $72\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. in said old road, and on lands of said H. A. Berwin, two hundred and Seventy-five, (275) feet to a post; - thence S. $85\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. still on lands of said H. A. Berwin, six hundred and eighty-seven (687) feet to a post; - thence N. $78\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., still on lands of said H. A. Berwin, two hundred and eighty-seven (287) feet, to a post; - thence N. $33\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. still on lands of said H. A. Berwin, three hundred and ninety-eight (398) feet to a post in the public road leading from Dubois to Sabula. The undersigned further report that there are no damages resulting to the respective owners of the land through which said road passes, by reason of the opening of the same. Also, that before said view, public notice of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put up at three of the most public places in the vicinity, ten days before said meeting. And we annex a plot or draft of said road laid out, stating the courses and distances, and noticing briefly the improvements through which the same passes, and also a description and draft of the road vacated.

NOTE.—In case of a private road, the release must be executed in favor of the petitioner for said road.
Also—Viewers will carefully note the number of days employed and set the amount out at the foot of their return. Viewers cannot interfere with damages assessed by the original viewers, except so far as the location may be changed by the viewers.
N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages, as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.



To the Honorable, the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County.

The petition of the undersigned respectfully represents:

That they labor under great inconvenience, for want of a public road, to begin in a public road leading from DuBois to Sabula, at a point about three hundred feet North of ~~Rixroad~~ A.V. Railroad crossing on land of H. A. Berwind, in the Township of Sandy, and to end in said public road leading from DuBois to Sabula at a point on ~~South~~ West line between John E. DuBois and said H. A. Berwind, opposite road leading from Shaffer siding to New Salem, in said Sandy Township: The petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint the requisite number of persons qualified according to law, to view the ground proposed for such road and, if they should see occasion to lay out the same, to inquire of and vacate the public road now opened from the intersection of road leading from New Salem to Shaffer siding with the road from DuBois to Sabula, at the end of the proposed new road, to a point three hundred feet North of the A.V. Railway Crossing on land of H. A. Berwind, in the township of Sandy, which last mentioned road will, by reason of the laying out of the proposed road, become useless; and make report of their proceedings to the next Court.
