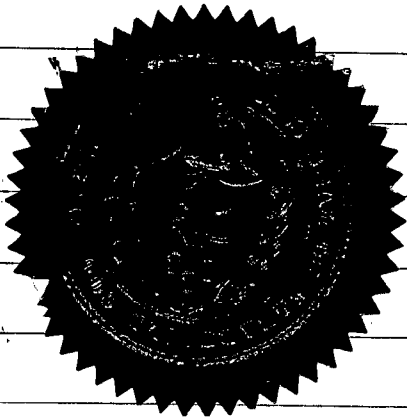

We the undersigned Viewers, Appointed
by the within Order of Court, to view the Site for
a Bridge across Moshannon Creek in Morris Twp
as therein mentioned Respectfully report.

That having given notice of the time, and place of
meeting, according to the Act of Assembly, and being all
present at the view of the site proposed for the said
Bridge, and being all sworn or affirmed, in pursuance
of the said Order of Court. We have Viewed the said
Site, and find that in our opinion, a Bridge at that
point is absolutely necessary for public use. And we
are of opinion that the expence of erecting said Bridge
will be too great for the Township of Morris to bear, or even
one half of said expence, and we therefore recommend that
the County bear the expence of building one abutments
and one half the expence of putting on the Bridge. Said
Moshannon Creek being the line between the Counties of
Clearfield, and Centre. Said Bridge we are of opi-
nion should be eighty feet (80) in length. And Twelve
(12) feet high from low water mark.

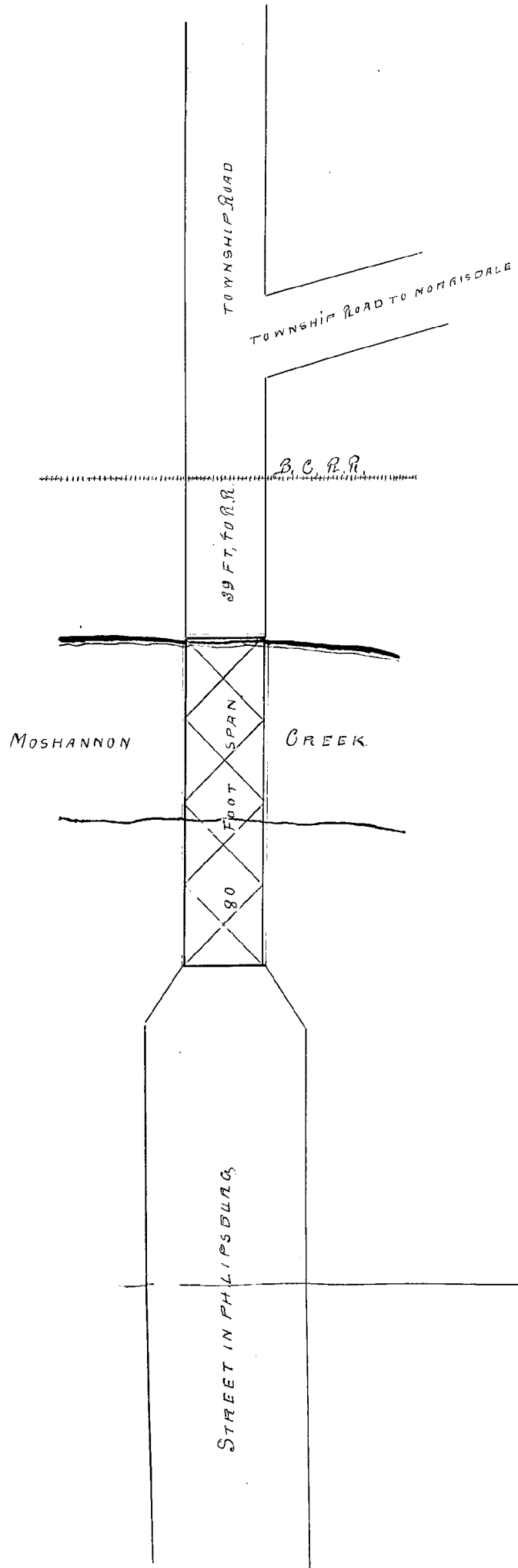
