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To the Honorable, the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Clearfield County, Penna.

We, the subscribers, persons appointed by the Court to
view the place proposed for the bridge in the within order mention-
ed, respectfully report:

That having all met at the place designated for said
bridge and having been each duly sworn to perform our duties with
fidelity and according to law, and having first given public
notice as required by law of the time of said view, and having
given personal notice to the County Commissioners of the same, we
proceeded to view the site for said bridge, in pursuance of said
order, and having viewed the same, we are of the opinion that a
bridge over Mosquito Creek at the place where the public road lead-
ing from Keewaydin to Schnarrs Mills crosses said Creek, is neces-
sary for public use, and that the erecting of such a bridge would
be attended with more expense than it is reasonable the said
Township of Karthus should bear.
