WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, PERSONS, APPOINTED BE THE WITHIN ORDER OF COURT, TO VIEW AND LAY OUT THE ROAD THERIN MENTIONED RESPECTFULLY REPORT: THAT HAVING BEEN PRESENT AT THE VIEW OF THE GROUND PROPOSED FOR SUCH ROAD, AND HAVING ALL BEEN FIRST SEVERALLY SWORN OR AFFIRM, IN PURSUANCE OF THE SAID WE HAVE VIEWED AND LAYED OUT, AND DO RETURN FOR PUBLIC USE, THE FOLLOWING ROAD, TO WIT: BEGINNING AT A POINT, FIFTY FEET FROM ALEXANDER RUN, BRIDGE, THENCE NORTH EIGHTY SEVEN DEGREES EAST THREE HUNDRED AND SIXTY TWO FEET, PASSING THE TENANTMENT HOUSE OF JOHN R. JOBLING THENCE BY THE IMPROVED PROPERTY OF JOHN R. JOPLING, JAMES CORNELY, G. W. LAMBOURNE, JOSEPH DENY, MRS. L. ROBINS, THOMAS SHAW, AND THE PUBLIC SCHOOL HOUSE, ALSO PROPERTY OF WILLIAM O'HARA, MRS. RUFNER, MRS. JOPLING, AND JES. W. and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, to make report at Sept 28 1892 whereupon the Court, upon due consideration of the premises, do order and appoint J. M. Gangle, Thos. Glynn, W. Albert Shoff who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
