and order filed in this pro-
ceeding and to vacate and
supply the same if it be
deemed necessary so to do.
Do respectfully report that
having given due public notice
by three written and printed hand-
bills, put up near the location
of said road, and also by notice
to the Commissioners of Clearfield
County, of the time and place of
meeting as appears by a copy
thereof, hereto attached.

We met at the Rock Spring School
House in Bell Township at 9 o'clock
A.M. on the 15th June A.D. 1892 and
having been all first severally
sworn according to law proceeded
to view said road in said order to
us directed, and described, and upon
a full investigation we have decided
to report in favor of vacating that
portion of said road near Rock Spring
School house, beginning at a point

in Puxsuttawney road and running
 $88\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}W$ 28 $\frac{3}{4}$ rods, and to supply same by
road beginning at a point in Puxsuttawney
road and running $N47\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}W$ 17 rods to intersection
road at point of vacation, also to vacate
said road from sugar tree on land of
Bigler and running through land of
Bigler to intersection of Troutville road near
Daniel Foye's line and to supply same
by shorter route beginning at said sugar tree
hence on land of Bigler $86\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}E$ 7 rods $85\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}E$
rods hence through land of Henry Brub

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 23

day of May, A. D. 1892, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bell

, in said county, setting forth that

A road was formerly laid out by order of Court from Pumputanny road at or near Rock Spring School House to intersect road leading to Troutville near Daniel Myers line, part of which said road has never been opened which part by reason of distance & lay of ground could be supplied by shorter distance & better ground & serve the travelling public better & by less expence & burden to the tax payers - Supply on said line at or near N. E. corner of Joseph Parish land to Troutville road by supplying same from said point to intersect Troutville road & vacate a part near Rock Spring School House

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~and report to next Term~~ ^{re locate & supply}

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Edgar Bridge John Dent Jacob Farwell who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law. Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court.
