At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 19th day of September, A. D. 1897, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Konow

Konow, in said county, setting forth that a public road has been laid out through Konow a portion of which road Beginning at a point on the road known as the "Belona Road" at the End of land on land of Mc Park and Ending at a Corner in lands of Jonathan Walker & John Saughman Estate in said Township has become useless burdensome and inconvenient and can be better supplied by a much shorter road

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ^{Vacate & Supply} and lay out the same according to law ^{Make report at Dec 1897}

whereupon the Court, upon due consideration of the premises, do order and appoint ^{Vacate & Supply} Harry Evers H. J. Sloppy & James Savage

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed

for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such ^{Vacate & Supply} road, they shall proceed to lay out the same

agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the

least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft

of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from per-

sons through whose lands said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof

to the next court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law.

Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated lands through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to

severally sworn or affirmed we have viewed vacated and supplied
as follows: beginning at end of lane on land of W. C. Parke we vacated

South eighty nine degrees East twenty six perches thence North
seventy five degrees East eight and two tenth perches to Abram
Walkers East Line, which road we supplied by beginning at last men-
tioned point thence South forty one and fourth degrees West eighty per-
ches to Public road leading in straight line to end of W. C. Parke's Lane
thence beginning at end of road vacated we follow present location
of road toward Jonathon Walkers to point on line between Jonathon
Bingham Estate and B. Ordine Owens about fourteen rods South East
from Abram Walkers Corner thence vacate road North seventy four
and one half degrees East four and one tenth perches thence
South eighty one degrees East thirty seven and four tenth perches
thence South seventy one degrees fifty minutes East eighteen and
