The petition of the undersigned citizens and tax-payers of
Rigier Township, respectfully represent,

That a township road leading from a point on the Madera and
Glen Hope Township road, near the old stone house, to a point on
the Township road leading from Madera to Janesville, was long
since laid out,

That a portion of this road, to wit:- beginning at a point of
intersection with the Madera and Glen Hope Township road and
ending at or near Robert Whitesides barn, has become useless,
and for the last ten or twelve years has been almost totally
abandoned, that no work and but little travel has been done upon
and over the said road,

That the same crosses Clearfield Creek at Lords Ferry, and
that the said fording has become impassable and has been so for
the last ten or twelve years.

point viewers to view and vacate said road.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Fourth day of September, A. D. 1893, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bigler, in said County, setting forth that

That a Township road leading from a point on the Madera and Glenhope Twp road near the Old Stone house to a point on the Lup road leading from Madera to Jansville was long since laid out. That a portion of this road to wit: Beginning at a point of intersection with the Madera & Glenhope Twp road and ending at or near Robert Whitesides barn has become useless and for the last Eight or ten years has been almost totally abandoned that no work and little travel has been done upon and over said road. That it crosses Clearfield Creek at Lord's Ferry and that the said fording has become impassable and has been so for the last ten or twelve years and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ ^{Vacate} the same according to law, and make report to the Court whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Asa Spencer, Wm Pease and Robert McNamee who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said ~~road~~ and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such ~~road~~ ^{Vacate} they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ ^{Vacate} the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, ~~having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court. 
