



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, Pennsylvania, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the fourth day of December, A. D. 1893, before Judge of said Court, upon a petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Kiwoy, in said County, setting forth that

They labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road ~~or~~ or highway to lead from the Public Road at or near Jackson Sawmill through Erhardville to a point on the Public road at or near Daniel P. Brown's a distance of near two miles

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, ~~and make report to the Court~~ whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Harry Byers, Peter Patterson ^{and} David Johnson who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds proposed for said road, and if they view the same and any two of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and state particularly, whether they judge the same necessary for a PUBLIC or PRIVATE road, together with a plot or draft of the same, with the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which it passes, and shall also procure releases of damages from persons through whose land said road may pass, or failing to procure such releases, shall assess the same, if any sustained, and shall make report thereof to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn and affirmed according to law, Notice is directed to be given to the owners or occupants of seated land through which the within road is intended to pass, of the time of the view, according to the 147th Rule of Court. To The Honorable the Judge of the Court of Limitations of Clearfield County Pennsylvania we.
The undersigned viewers appointed by the within order of Court to view and layout the road therein mentioned respectfully report that we gave good and lawful notices of said roadview by posting notices and with five days notice to County Commissioners of said County and having met on day appointed in said notices and having been first severally sworn or affirmed we have viewed the ground for the proposed road and have laid out the following road to wit: Beginning at point near Jacksons mill on one public road being point where Road to New Mill fort leaves said Public road in Knox Township thence by said Public road toward Ainserville South fifty two and three-fourth degrees West twenty-eight perches to a post thence through unimproved land of Mary Bailey as follows South thirteen degrees West twenty and five tenth perches to Hemlock thence South thirty three degrees East four and seven tenth perches to Hemlock thence South fifty seven and one fourth degrees East twenty one and six tenth perches to post thence South fifty degrees East (at + centre Potts Run) sixty six and two tenth perches to post thence South sixty nine (69 1/2) and one half degrees East eighteen perches to a Maple thence South eighty one and three fourth degrees East sixty three and four tenth perches to Hemlock stump thence through land of D & E Erhard South seventy three degrees East twenty five and six tenth perches to a Hemlock thence South eighty three degrees East thirteen and seven tenth perches to an Ash sapling thence South fifty eight degrees forty five minutes East twenty nine and one tenth perches to post in street in Erhardville thence by said street south seventy three degrees East thirty two perches thence South seven and one half degrees East ten perches to a post thence South fifteen and one half degrees East twelve perches to a Maple thence south one and one half degrees East nine and five tenth perches to a post thence South sixty six and three-fourth degrees East crossing R. R. five perches to a post thence North sixty seven degrees twenty minutes East eighteen and eight tenth perches to a post thence North six degrees West through a street in Erhardville twenty nine and one tenth perches to post thence North twenty degrees East nine and six tenth perches to a post thence North twenty seven degrees East eleven perches to a post thence South seventy degrees East eighteen and eight tenth perches to a post thence South eighty six degrees East twenty three perches to a post thence through land of Bloom South eighty seven degrees East ten and five tenth perches to a maple thence North seventy four degrees East eleven perches to a Hemlock stump thence North one and one half degrees West thirty four perches to a Hemlock thence North fifteen degrees East nineteen and one tenth perches to a gum thence North eighty and one half degrees East twelve perches to a Red Oak stump thence North seventy five and one half degrees East twenty five perches to a sugar thence North fifty three and one half degrees East eighteen perches to point opposite a marked Chestnut on Public road near Dan Bloom. A plot or draft of which road as aforesaid laid out is hereto annexed showing courses distances and improvements etc which road is necessary in our opinion for a public road We believe no owner of land is entitled to damage by reason of the locating or opening the said road.  N. B.—If the viewers believe the parties are not entitled to damages, taking into consideration the advantages as well as the disadvantages of the road, they will report to that effect.
